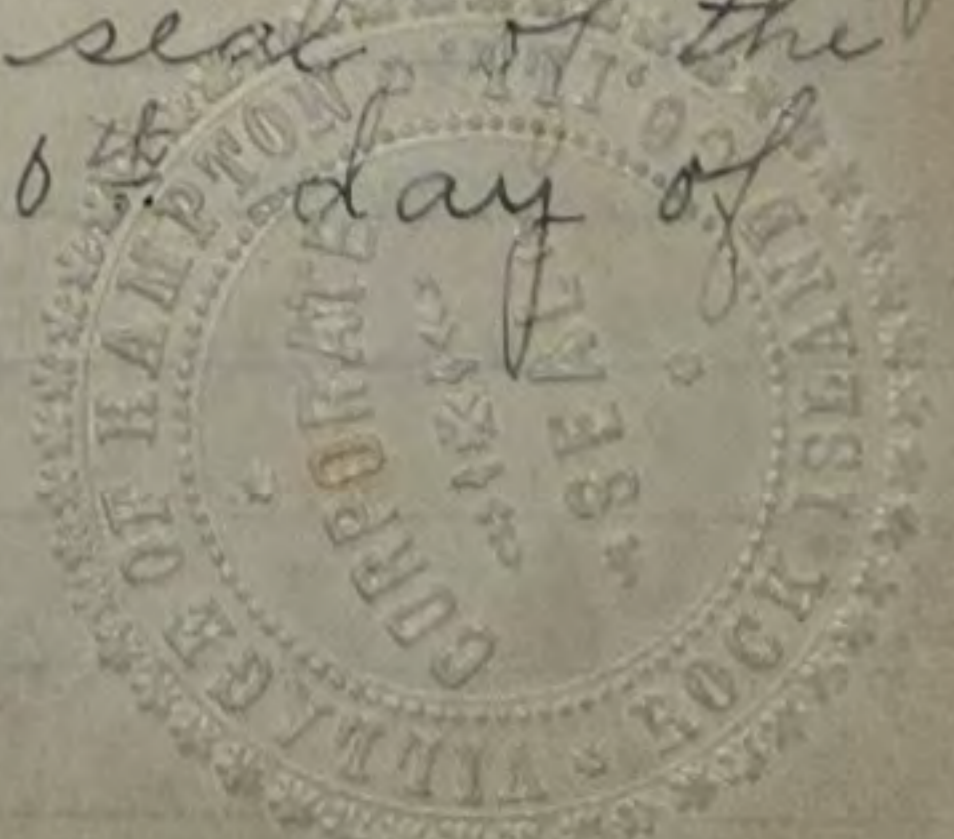

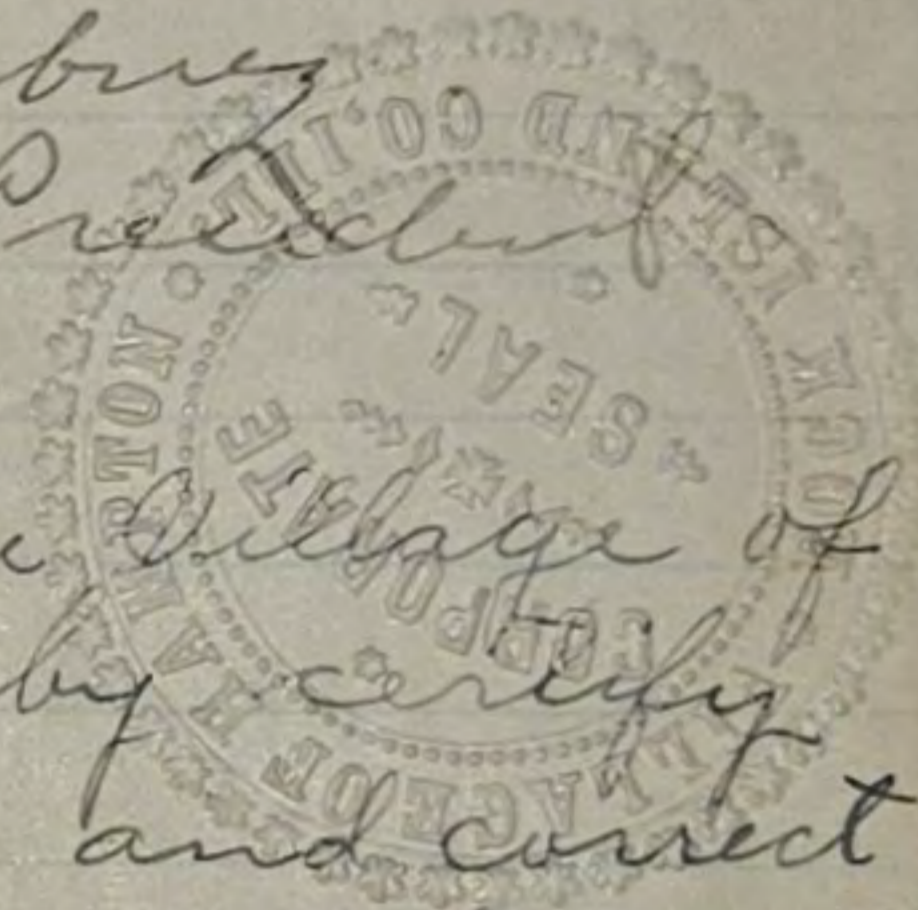

Ordinance No 80

An ordinance entitled an ordinance granting to the Peoples Power Company, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and Franchise to string wires, set poles and other appliances necessary and convenient for furnishing electric light heat and power in the streets, avenue, alleys and public places in the Village of Hampton, Illinois

Whereas, on the 2nd day of October, 1912, petitions of the owners of property representing more than one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the frontage of each and all of the streets, avenues, alleys and public grounds in said Village of Hampton, and also signed by the owners of land representing more than one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the frontage of each mile and ~~the~~ fraction of a mile, if any, in excess of the whole, measuring respectively from the initial points named in such petitions in each and all of said streets, avenues, alleys and public grounds and of the respective parts thereof sought to be used for purpose hereinafter mentioned requesting the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton to grant unto the Peoples Power Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Illinois, and to its successors and assigns, the right, privilege concession and authority hereinafter in said ordinance described, were presented to

said Board of Trustees of said Village of Hampton, and Whereas, the said Board of Trustees of the said Village of Hampton, after the filing of said petitions and before the passage of this ordinance, fully heard, examined and considered said petitions, and it appeared to them and they found that the said petitions were signed by all of the owners of land representing more than one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the frontage of each and all of the streets, avenues alleys and public grounds in the said Village of Hampton, and also signed by the owners of land representing more than one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the frontage of each mile and the fraction of a mile, if any, in excess of the whole, measuring respectively from the initial points named in such petitions and of each and all of said streets, avenues, alleys and public grounds and of the respective parts thereof sought to be used for the purposes hereinafter and in this ordinance mentioned, in accordance and in full compliance with the statute of the State of Illinois in such case made and provided:

Now be it ordained, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton, Illinois. ¶

Sec 1.

That permission, authority and consent be, and the same is hereby granted, to the Peoples Power Company, its successors and assigns, to use the streets, avenues, and public grounds of the Village of Hampton, Illinois,

(and on petition of the property holders of any streets hereafter laid out) for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and using thereon posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, with all the necessary, useful and convenient appurtenances and appendages and of stringing, maintaining and using on the same, the necessary wires for conducting currents of electricity in and through the said Village and in the vicinity thereof, for light, heat and power; the said posts, poles, mast arms, etc., shall be so placed under the direction of the Street and Alley Committee of the Village Board and the wires upon them be kept at such elevation as to avoid danger to persons and adjacent property and to the use of such streets and alleys for other lawful purposes.

Sec 2. Said poles, posts, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances and appendages shall be so placed, under the supervision of the Board of Trustees as not to interfere with the construction or placing of any water pipe, gas pipe, drain or sewer, or the flow of water therein, that has been or may be placed by the authority of said Village. When in case of bringing to grade or change of grade on any streets or alleys whereon such posts, poles, cross arms, mast arms, appurtenances and appendages may have been erected and placed,

it shall be necessary to reset said posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances or appendages, then said Peoples Power Company, its successors or assigns shall change such posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances or appendages and reset same at their own expense under the direction of the Board of Trustees of said Village.

Sec. 3.

The Board of Trustees reserves the right to grant to any other company or person like permission to erect, maintain and use the necessary posts, poles mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances, appendages and wires to properly conduct electricity for lighting, heat and power purposes, such erections not to interfere with the proper use of the poles and wires then erected under the permission granted by this ordinance.

Sec. 4.

Said Village of Hampton shall at all times during the existence of the privilege hereby granted, have free use of said poles, upon which to place the wires for any fire and police alarm systems which it may at any time install, said use to be at the risk of said Village.

Sec. 5.

The said Peoples Power Company, its successors and assigns, shall be liable for, and pay to the person or persons injured, all damages resulting from the erection, maintaining and placing of such posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances,

appendages and wires under the permission given under this ordinance as well as from carelessness or mis-conduct of any agent or employee of said company, its successors or assigns, in placing or maintaining or using such posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances, appendages and wires so placed and also hold said Village safe and harmless from any damage and costs or causes of action that may accrue against it by reason of the placing and maintaining of such posts, poles, mast arms, cross arms, appurtenances, appendages and wires and carelessness or misconduct of any agent or employee of said company in regard to the same.

Sec. 6

The said Peoples Power Company, its successors and assigns, shall furnish the electricity to consumers in the Village of Hampton, during the life of this license for light, heat, and power and shall at no time charge a higher rate than is charged in the territory which is now the city of East Moline in said county for similar service, provided, That the said company, its successors and assigns, shall have the lawful right to charge and collect minimum charge of One Dollar and Twenty Five Cents (\$1.25) per month for each Meter.

Sec. 7

The license hereby granted shall extend Thirty One (31) years only from date of its passage, unless terminated before that time by default of the company and within six months from its termination said company shall remove all its poles, wires, apparatus and fixtures from the streets and alleys of said Village and in case said company shall fail to remove the same within said period the city may remove the same at the expense of said company.

Sec. 8

In consideration of this license the company in accepting this ordinance agrees that it shall and will install apparatus and light said Village and the streets and public places thereof with electricity during the life of this license in accordance with the following specifications, to-wit:-

All out door lights furnished shall be 80 candle power, incandescent lights and shall be operated in full power as near as practicable. Said lights shall be suspended at street intersections and other places in the streets and public ground of said Village as the Village Board shall direct. Said lights shall be lighted 30 minutes after sun set and shall be kept lighted until midnight of every night each year except the three nights of full moon of each month when they shall not be lighted at all, provided however, that all lights shall be lighted on the nights last mentioned whenever

the moon shall be obscured by clouds and when ordered by the President of the Village Board, such order to be given a reasonable time before the lights are to be lighted. The company shall furnish such number of street lights as may be required by the Village board, not less than Twenty (20) at such locations as the Village Board may direct and no change shall be required in the location of lamps within six months from the date of completion of said plant and after that date changes in location shall not exceed one lamp a year at the expense of the company and such new location shall not exceed, (600) feet from the nearest established circuit, measured along the line on which wire shall be stretched.

The Village Board may make such other changes in location as it may desire but at the expense of the Village. New lights shall be placed at such places as the Village Board may direct within six (6) months after notice in writing that Village Board requires such new light. The company shall have the right to trim trees that interfere with wire but no trees shall be trimmed until the Street and Alley Committee of the Village has passed upon the question of interference. Said lights to be furnished at,

and the Village to pay therefor; the following rates:-

For each and every light burning until midnight the sum of \$1.25 per month.

For each and every light burning to 1:00 o'clock A.M. \$1.50 per month.

For each and every light burning 30 minutes before sun rise the sum of \$2.00 per month. The above rate shall be in force for a period of Five (5) years from the date when said lighting begins and after that date, shall be as low as the lowest average rate of any four Villages or Cities of similar size, for which similar lights are furnished within a radius of seventy-five (75) miles.

Sec. 9.

No special tax on poles or other special taxes or assessments shall be imposed or levied by said Village on said Company for its use or occupation of the streets, alleys, or public grounds, for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and using its towers, poles, wires and accessories, necessary or convenient in carrying out the provisions of this contract and also that said Village shall not require the Company during the life of this ordinance to place its wires under ground. The Village shall protect all property of the company from injury, the same as if it ~~was~~ the property of the Village.

Sec. 10.

The Company shall also furnish to the Village free of charge, sufficient electricity to light the City Hall and

Police Station during the life of this license, the number and placing of said lights to be designated by the Village Board.

Sec. 11.

In case said company shall make default in any of the things provided to be done by it in the foregoing ordinance and such default shall continue for a period of six (6) months after notice in writing by the President of the Village Board, the Village Board may terminate this ordinance and all provisions herein shall apply to and be equally binding upon said Company, its successors and assigns.

Sec. 12

The said Peoples Power Company, its successors or assigns shall within ten (10) days from the passage of this ordinance, file with the Village Clerk of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, its acceptance in writing of the terms thereof, and said plant shall be completed and in operation within six (6) months from the passage of this ordinance and in case of the failure of said Company to accept this ordinance in writing within said Ten (10) days, or to complete and have in operation said plant within six months from said date, then this ordinance shall be of no further effect.

Ordinance No 87 Weed Ordinance

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton Illinois,

Sec. 1. That weeds and brush growing upon lots within in the limits of the Village where said lots are fronting upon the permanent sidewalk, built of plank or other material, shall be deemed a nuisance. Any owner occupant or agent of any such lot after having been given five days notice in writing by the Village Marshall to abate such nuisance, shall be liable to a fine of not less than Three (3) nor more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and should the said nuisance not then be abated, such owner, occupant or agent shall again be notified and fined in like manner for a failure to abate such nuisance under the second notice, and in addition thereto to be fined the amount that it will cost to have such weeds or brush removed, and such additional amount to be turned into the Village Treasury of said Village to be used for the purpose of abating the nuisance.

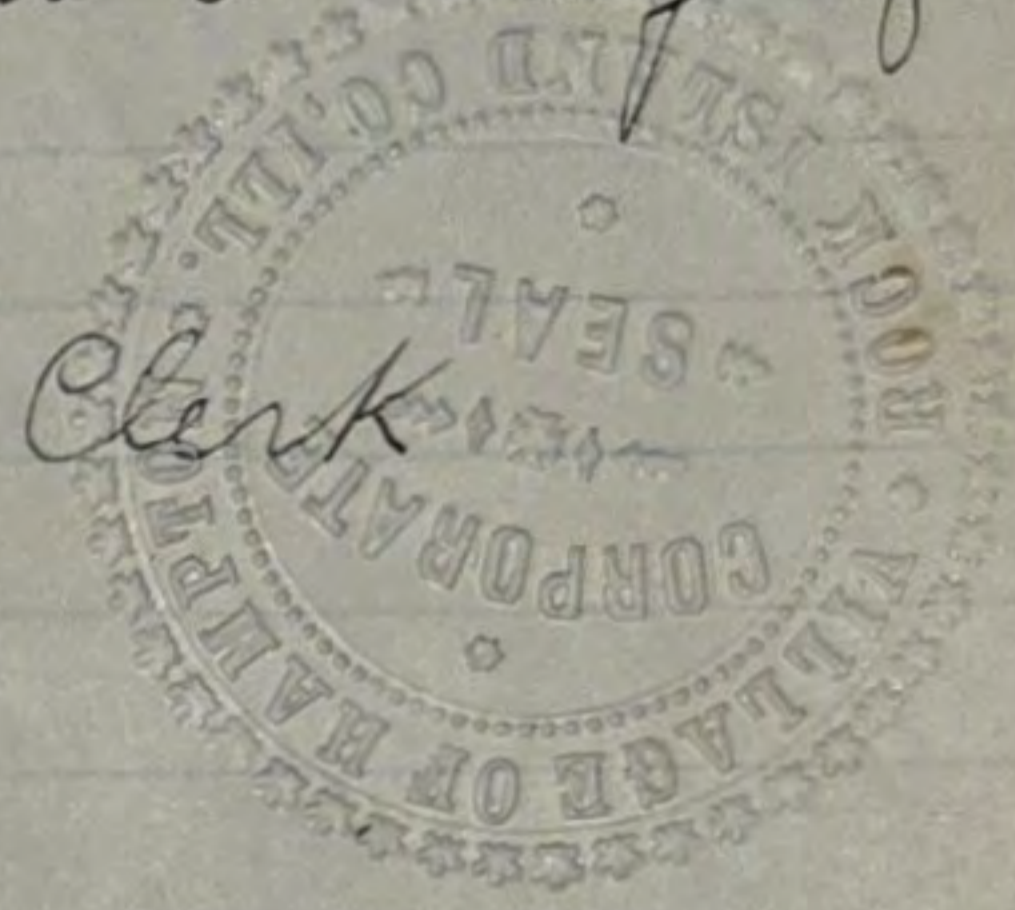

Any person or persons who shall place any obstruction upon any sidewalk, street, or alley in said Village or in any manner interfere with the surface of the same so as to endanger the safety of persons, teams or vehicles passing on or over the same, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each offense.

Sec. 2. Any person or persons who shall leave any cellar way, cellar door, vault, or pit in an open, unguarded or unsafe condition upon or adjoining any sidewalk, street or alley of said Village so as to endanger the safety of persons traveling upon or over the same shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each offense.

Sec. 3. Any person or persons who shall make any excavation upon the sidewalks, streets or alleys of said Village without permission of the Village authorities or who shall make any excavation upon land adjoining said sidewalks, streets or alleys so as to endanger the safety of persons, teams, or vehicles traveling on or over the

same shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars.

Sec 4.

No person or persons shall make any excavation upon land adjoining the sidewalks, streets, or alleys of said Village that will endanger their safety for public use unless in making such excavation they shall properly safeguard and secure the same so as to prevent persons traveling on or over the same from falling into the excavation or into the side, and also prevent the land of the adjoining sidewalks, streets and alleys from falling or sliding into the excavation, and in case of any such excavation being made which is not properly safeguarded or secured as above the person or persons making the same, or directing the same to be done shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each offense, and any such person or persons who may make such excavation, or direct the same to be done, who shall permit the excavation to remain improperly safeguarded or insecure as above after notice in writing by the Street Commissioner of said Village or other officer of said Village to safeguard or secure the excavation, such person or persons shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars



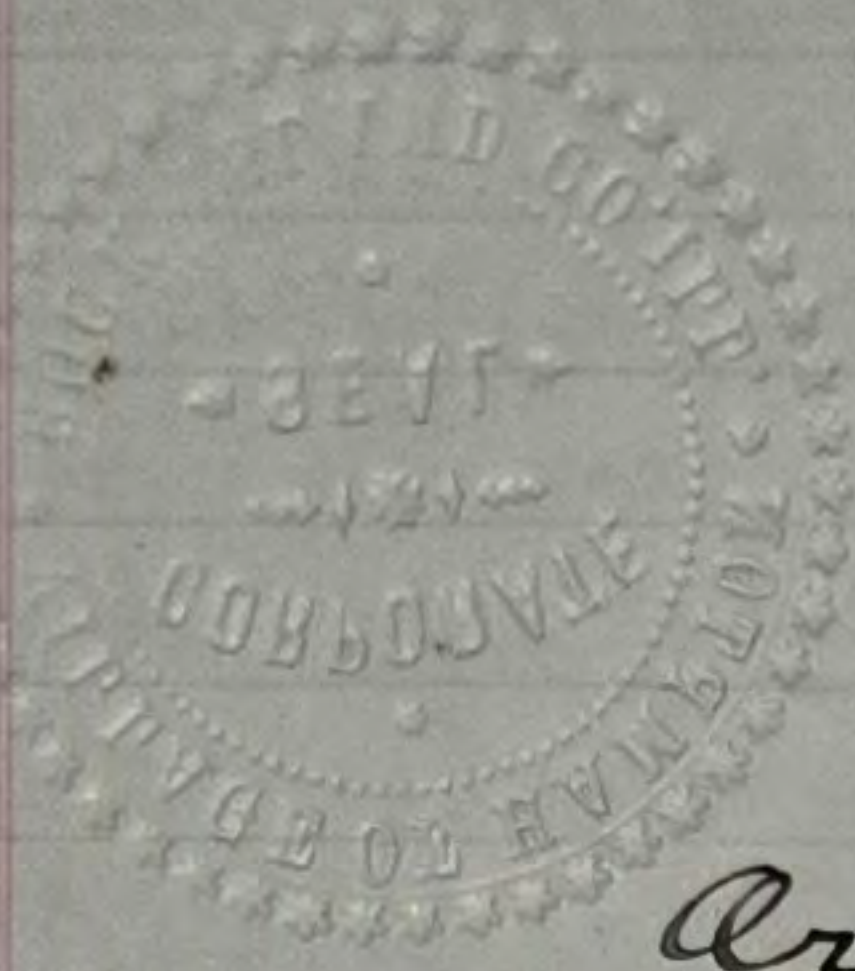

To establish the office of Electrical Inspector in and for the Village of Hampton to regulate and define the duties of such office and to establish rules and regulations concerning the installation, operation, and maintenance of electrical wiring and appliances, to fix penalties for the violation of its provisions and repealing all laws in conflict therewith.

The Village Board of the Village of Hampton, Illinois do ordain as follows,

Sec 1. The office of Electrical Inspector in and for the Village of Hampton, County of Rock Island and State of Illinois, is hereby created and said office shall be filled by a regular licensed electrician who shall be appointed by the Village President and approved by the Village Board; and such Inspector shall assume the duties of this office on and after the Passage and Posting of this Ordinance and shall hold his office during good behavior and until his successor is duly appointed and qualified in the manner provided for the appointment and qualification of an Electrical Inspector for the Village of Hampton, and such Electrical Inspector shall not be removed from office except for failure to properly perform his duties as prescribed in this Ordinance or any part Ordinance regulating electrical wire or apparatus now in force, or which may be adopted. alleys or buildings in this Village,
shall use only wires that are suitable

all wires abandoned for use; shall
suitably insulate every wire where
it enters a building and if such wire
is other than wire designed to carry
an electric light or power current,
shall attach it at suitable and
convenient points in the circuit,
calculated to prevent danger from
fire and near the place of entering the
buildings, an appliance calculated to
prevent at all times a current of
electricity of such intensity or volume
as to be capable of injuring electrical
instruments or causing fire from
entering the building by means of such
wire, beyond the point at which such
appliance is attached.

Sec 3 No Corporation, Co-partnership, association
or individual shall engage in the
business or hold himself out to the
Public as engaged in the business of
installing electrical wiring and

apparatus to be used in connection with electrical light, heat or power within any building in the Village of Hampton without first appearing in person or by a duly authorized representative at the office of the Village Clerk and register his name and address, or the name and address of the Corporation, -

Co-partnership, association or individual represented, which act will entitle the Corporation, Co-partnership, association or individual so registered to receive a Certificate of Registration, which shall be good for one year from its date, said Certificate of Registration, shall entitle the holder thereof to engage in the business of installing electrical wiring and apparatus within the limits of the Village of Hampton, provided, however, that no Certificate of Registration shall be issued until the Corporation, Co-partnership, association or individual registered shall have filed with the Village Clerk a bond with good and sufficient sureties in the penal sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, Conditional upon the faithful performance of all contracts entered into for the installing of electrical wiring and apparatus and the failure of the holder of any Certificate of Registration to fully comply with the conditions of a contract for the installation of electrical wiring or apparatus shall be deemed sufficient cause for the forfeiture of said bond. The money realized upon the forfeiture of any

bond over and above any expense involved in its forfeiture shall be expended in making the necessary changes in the electrical wiring or apparatus found to be deficient in quality or quantity or other particulars as specified in the Contract or Contracts entered into and covered by the bond declared forfeited and the unexpended balance of said money if any, shall be paid into the Village Treasury. Upon the forfeiture of the bond as provided for in said Ordinance the Certificate of Registration issued upon the filing of said bond shall also be void and its privileges revoked and no renewal thereof shall be permissible within a year of the date of said forfeiture.

Said Certificate of Registration shall be forfeited if the holder thereof shall fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of any Ordinance of this Village.

Sec 4 Approved metallic Conduits shall be used for enclosing all concealed electric light or power wiring in new buildings, the rewiring of old buildings and in new installations in old buildings or additions thereto located within the district known as "Fire Limits."

Sec 5 All wiring for electric light or power hereafter installed in Churches, theaters and other places used for public gatherings in the Village of Hampton, shall be installed in suitable approved metallic conduits and all such wires hereafter installed in unfinished basements in buildings other than dwellings

designed for the occupancy of more than three families, shall be likewise placed in similar Conduits.

sec 6

It shall be the duty of the Electrical Inspector to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance or any Ordinance or Ordinances now in force or which may hereafter be adopted concerning electrical wiring or apparatus.

sec 7

No wire or wires shall be installed, operated or maintained over any street, alley, sidewalk or building in this Village which shall be liable to seriously interfere with the work of the Fire Department in the use of ladders or other apparatus, or which shall obstruct or render hazardous the use of fire escape, and on complaint of the Chief of the Fire Department, said obstructing, interfering or hazardous wires shall be removed or properly rearranged.

sec 8

wherever possible and expedient signal wires shall not be carried on the same pole or in dangerous proximity to high potential electric light or Power wires and where a joint occupancy Pole line composed of these two classes of system is necessary or where the routes traversed by these systems cross each other, the high potential electric light or Power wires shall be placed and maintained not less than four feet above every signal wire, and where it is impossible to provide for such separation, it shall be the duty of the Electrical Inspector to arrange and enforce

an equitable and safe alternative Plan.

Rec 9 The said Electrical Inspector or his assistant shall make a thorough inspection of all electrical wires and appliances within the Village of Hampton, at least once in each year and where wires or appliances are in dangerous or unsafe condition, or are deemed to be an interference with the work of the fire department, he shall notify the Person, firm or Company owning, using or operating them to place them in a safe, secure and non-interfering condition. Any Corporation, Co-partnership, association or individual or agent thereof failing, neglecting or refusing within a reasonable time to make the necessary repairs or changes and have the necessary work completed within a reasonable time after the receipt of said notice shall be deemed guilty of violation of this Ordinance and every day which shall elapse after the expiration of said reasonable time until said wires or appliances are repaired, removed or changed as required by said Electrical Inspector, shall be considered a separate offense within the intent and meaning of this Ordinance.

Rec 10 The Electrical Inspector, by and with the consent of the President of the Village of Hampton shall have power to deputize one or more assistants and each one of said assistants shall in every case be known to be competent to discharge the duties of Electrical Inspector and the rights and privileges conferred upon

The Electrical Inspector are hereby conferred upon each assistant Electrical Inspector when properly appointed,

Sec 11

The said Electrical Inspector or competent assistant appointed by him shall have the right during reasonable hours to enter any building, manhole, or sub-way, in the discharge of his official duties, or for the purpose of making any test of the electrical apparatus or appliances therein contained, and for that purpose he shall be given prompt access to all buildings, private or public, and to all manholes and sub-ways on application to the Company or individual owning or in charge or control of the same,

Sec 12

The Chief of the Fire Department, or the Electrical Inspector, or a competent person delegated by them or either of them shall have the power to at once cause the removal of all wires, or the turning off of all electrical currents where the circuits interfere with the work of the Fire Department during the progress of the fire. The said Electrical Inspector is hereby authorized and empowered to cause the turning off of electric current from all conductors or apparatus which are deemed by him to be in an unsafe condition or which have not been installed in conformity with the provisions of this Ordinance. No Corporation — Co-partnership association or individual or agent thereof, shall supply or cause to be supplied any electric current

To Conductors or apparatus which has been deemed by said electrical inspector to be in an unsafe condition or which have not been installed in conformity with the provisions of this Ordinance and from which the said Electrical Inspector has caused the electric — current to be turned off.

Sec 13 No alteration or change shall be made in the electric wiring or appliances located within a building for use in connection with the production of electric light, heat or power, nor shall any such electric wiring or appliances be installed in any building without first securing from the said Electrical Inspector a permit therefore. nor shall any change be made in any wiring or appliances after inspection without notifying the said Electrical Inspector and securing a permit therefore.

The fees for securing permits shall be as follows. all permits for electric wiring or appliances located within a residence building for use in connection with the production of electric, heat, light and power, shall be One (\$1.00) Dollar, which shall be paid in advance to the Electrical Inspector when the permit is given. all such permits for store buildings, churches, theater buildings, lodge rooms, flat buildings, consisting of four or more apartments and motion picture houses shall be Two (\$2.00)

Dollars, payable also in advance when permit is issued, provided, however, that the Electrical Inspector, by and with the approval of the fire, light and water Committee in and for the Village of Hampton may issue a permit — without charging any fee therefor, when any small change is to be made in the electric wiring or appliances located in any building. The Electrical Inspector shall receive all fees collected for permits as his salary and wages for the work which he does and performs in connection with his duties of Electrical Inspector and shall report the amount of fees received and from whom received to the Village Board each and every month on and after the date of his appointment as long as he continues in the office of Electrical Inspector no other fee or salary to be paid to him except the aforesaid,

Sec 14

Before issuing a permit for the installation of any wiring or appliances or the alteration or change in any wiring or appliances as provided in sec 13, an application shall be filed with the Electrical Inspector describing such installation or the alterations or changes to be made including the appliances and material used. No deviation shall be made in the details for wiring or appliances as shown by the application without permission from the Electrical Inspector in writing,

Sec 15

Upon the completion of the installation

of electrical wires or appliances in any building for use in connection with electrical light, heat and Power, it shall be the duty of the Corporation, Co-partnership, Association or individual doing the same to notify said Electrical Inspector or competent assistant deputized by him who shall at once inspect the same, and if approved by him he shall issue a Certificate of Satisfactory inspection, which shall contain the date of inspection and an outline of the results of such examination, but no Certificate shall be issued unless all apparatus, wires etc, connected therewith are in strict conformity with the rules and regulations herein set forth; nor shall current be turned on any wiring or appliance until a Certificate of Satisfactory inspection is issued.

All electrical construction, all material and appliances used in connection with electrical work, and the operation of all electrical apparatus, shall be in conformity with the rules and regulations set down in what is known as the "National Electrical Code," a copy of which is on file in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Hampton.

Sec 16 Any Corporation, Co-partnership, Association or individual or agent thereof, desiring to place any pipe, sheet metal or other material within six inches of any electrical wire or wires installed for use in connection with electric light, heat or Power shall, be bare

Proceeding with the execution of the work, obtain from the electrical inspector a permit therefore and on completion of said work the said Corporation, Co-partnership, association, or individual or agent thereof shall notify the said Electrical Inspector who shall be constrained to refer to wires installed in approved iron conduits.

Sec 17 No Corporation, Co-partnership, association or individual or agent thereof shall interfere with the Electrical Inspector or any competent person or persons lawfully deputized to assist him as hereinbefore provided, while in the performance of duty and each such interference shall be deemed to constitute a separate offence within the intent and meaning of this Ordinance.

Sec 18 The said Electrical Inspector shall keep a full and complete record of all work done, permits issued, examinations made on other official work performed as required by this Ordinance and shall annually make a full and detailed report thereof to the Village Board of all information concerning the condition and general arrangement of any electrical equipment at the time of the Electrical Inspector's last visit.

Sec 19 Any Corporation, Co-partnership — association, individual or agent thereof found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance or neglecting or refusing to comply

with any order of notice of the Electrical Inspector made pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and the Costs of prosecution for each and every offence.

Sec 20 All Ordinances or Parts of Ordinances in Conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec 21 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and Posting, Passed by the Village Board of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, this 5th day of April, A. D. 1919 and approved by the President, this 11th day of April A. D. 1919 Posted April 14th A. D. 1919

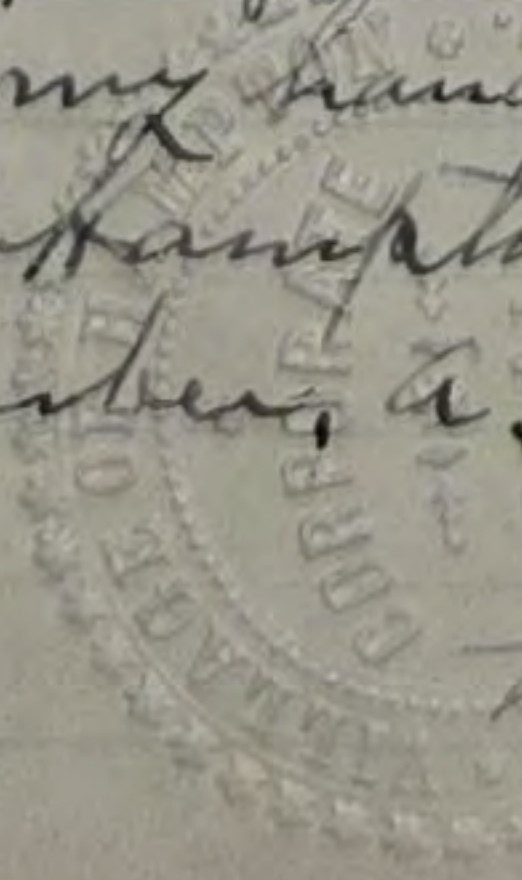

An Ordinance Number 106

An Ordinance prohibiting the emission of dense smoke from boats and providing for regulations and Penalty.

Be it ordained by the Village of Hampton, County of Rock Island, State of Illinois.

Sec. 1.

The emission of dense smoke within the Village of Hampton, Illinois, or upon waters of the Mississippi River bordering on said Village of Hampton to the extent of the dividing line between the state of Illinois and the state of Iowa from the smoke stack of any locomotive, steam boat, steam tug, steam derrick, steam pile driver, steam sand boat, steam shovel, or other similar machine or contrivance or from the smoke stack or chimney of any building or premises is hereby declared to be a nuisance and may be summarily abated by the Village Marshal or by any one whom the President of the board of trustees of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, may duly authorize for such purpose, such abatement may be in addition to the fine hereinafter provided.

Sec II.

Any person, firm or corporation owning, operating, or in charge or control of any locomotive, steam boat, steam tug, steam derrick, steam pile driver, steam sand boat, steam shovel, or other similar machine or contrivance of any building or premises who shall cause or permit the emission of dense smoke within the said Village of Hampton, Illinois, or on the waters of the Mississippi River to the line between the state of Illinois and the state of Iowa, from

the smoke stack or chimney of any such locomotive, steam boat, steam tug, steam derrick, steam pile driver, steam sand boat, steam shovel, or other similar machine or contrivance or from the smoke stack, or chimney of any building or premises so owned, controlled or in charge of her him or them, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this section and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than Ten (\$10) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars for each offense, and such emission of dense smoke is a violation of the provision of this section shall constitute a separate offense for each and every day on which such violation is continued.

Sec. III On the waters of the Mississippi River to the line between the state of Illinois and the state of Iowa, shall be construed to mean all that part of the Mississippi River bordering on the Village of Hampton, Illinois, from the shore line of said Village out to the line in said River between the state of Illinois and the state of Iowa.

Sec. IV This Ordinance shall be enforced upon its passage, approval and publication. Also, all ordinances in conflict with it is hereby repealed by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, this the 4th day of September A.D. 1920 and approved by the President of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, on the same date.

Ordinance Number 107

An Ordinance to license the keeping of Explosives and to Regulate Blasting In the Village of Hampton Ill. Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees of The Village of Hampton, in the County of Rock Island and State of Illinois.

No person, firm or Corporation shall have, keep, sell, use or give away any explosives within the Corporate limits of the Village of Hampton or on the waters of the Mississippi River to the line in said River between the state of Illinois, and the state of Iowa, excepting in the manner and upon the conditions herein provided and under a license issued by the Board of Trustees.

The President of the Board of Trustees shall have the Power to revoke any such license so issued in case there is any infraction of any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Any person, firm or Corporation desiring a license to keep, sell, offer for sale or give away any explosives of any kind or character whatever shall make application in writing to the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton for a license so to do setting forth in such application the name, residence and occupation of the applicant if individual and if a Corporation its name, Principal place of business and the names and residences of its officers, such application shall also set forth the location at which it is desired or intended to keep such explosives and the maximum amount of such explosives intended to be kept on hand at any one time at such place and the form and the manner in which such explosives are intended to be kept. If the Board of Trustees approved

such application they shall pass a motion granting a license to sell, keep or give away explosives and shall instruct the President of the Board of Trustees and the Village Clerk to sign such license upon the applicant paying to the Village Clerk the sum of Fifty Cents as a license fee, such license fee shall be good for one year and the applicant shall thereafter secure a new license and pay the new fee.

The annual fee for a license shall be Fifty Cents per year, also provided that if said applicant desires to keep on hand more than five (5) lbs. of explosives in the aggregate, then in such event such applicant shall furnish and file with the Village Clerk a bond with the surety to be approved by the Village Clerk conditional for the payment of any loss, damage or injury resulting to persons or property by reason of the use sale or keeping of such explosives, Every person, firm or corporation is prohibited to be connected with any blasting operations within the Village of Hampton or on the waters of the Mississippi River to the line in said River between the State of Illinois and the State of Iowa without first complying with the terms and conditions of this ordinance, Every person, firm or corporation which desires to blast must as hereinafter set forth make and file an application in writing with the Village Clerk of the Village of Hampton, Illinois, stating when said blasting will take place and also the location of the same together with the quantity and kind of explosives proposed to be used and the

name of the Person or persons who will perform the blasting operations, such application shall be presented to the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting or a special meeting called for that purpose together with a bond in the sum of Twenty-five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars given to secure said Village of Hampton and all persons, firms or corporations for all damages which the said Village or any person, firm or corporation or any persons firms or corporations incur by reason of said blasting. The Board of Trustees if it see fit shall instruct the Village Clerk to issue a license for such blasting, any Person, firm or Corporation or Co-partnership blasting within the Village of Hampton, Illinois or upon or under the waters of the Mississippi River from the shore or water line between the state of Illinois and the state of Iowa without first securing a license as this ordinance provides, shall be fined not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and not more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each and every offense. Every discharge of explosives in blasting or in any other manner shall be considered as a separate offense. Any person, firm or Corporation or Co-partnership violating any of the terms of this ordinance under which there is no penalty shall be fined at least Ten (\$10.00) Dollars and not more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each and every offense.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication thereof. All Ordinances or Parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. Passed by the Board of Trustees of the

Houses and lots fronting on streets, etc., to be numbered.

Sec. 4. The following shall be and is hereby adopted as the plan of numbering the houses, lots and parts of lots, fronting on any street, avenue or public place of said Village town:
The number of streets running North and South shall commence at First Avenue and the numbers from one to one hundred inclusive, so far as necessary, shall be used consecutively for the distance of the first block or fractional block, fifty numbers for each side of the street and even numbers for the right hand or East side of said avenue and odd

numbers for the left hand or west side of the avenue, one number shall be left for and applied to each thirty feet of distance and in any case where a building or place of business occupies less than thirty feet a fractional number shall be used. The numbers from one hundred and one to two hundred inclusive, shall in like manner be used for the second block in like manner for succeeding blocks consecutively. The numbering of streets running East and West shall be done in like manner commencing at First Street, even numbers being used for the right hand or south side of the street and odd numbers for the left hand or North side of the street.

Each lot and part of lot, fronting on any street, avenue or public place of said Village, not already correctly numbered, shall be numbered in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 5. The Committee on streets and alleys shall cause to be made and prepared the necessary maps and records to show the proper numbers to be assigned to all lots and parts of lots within said Village, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, and when completed the same shall be filed in the office of the Village Clerk and shall be evidence of the respective numbers or designations as aforesaid.

Sec. 6. When the said record is completed and filed with the Village Clerk as aforesaid, he shall give notice by publication by pasting 3 notices at 3 different public places in said Village of Hampton,

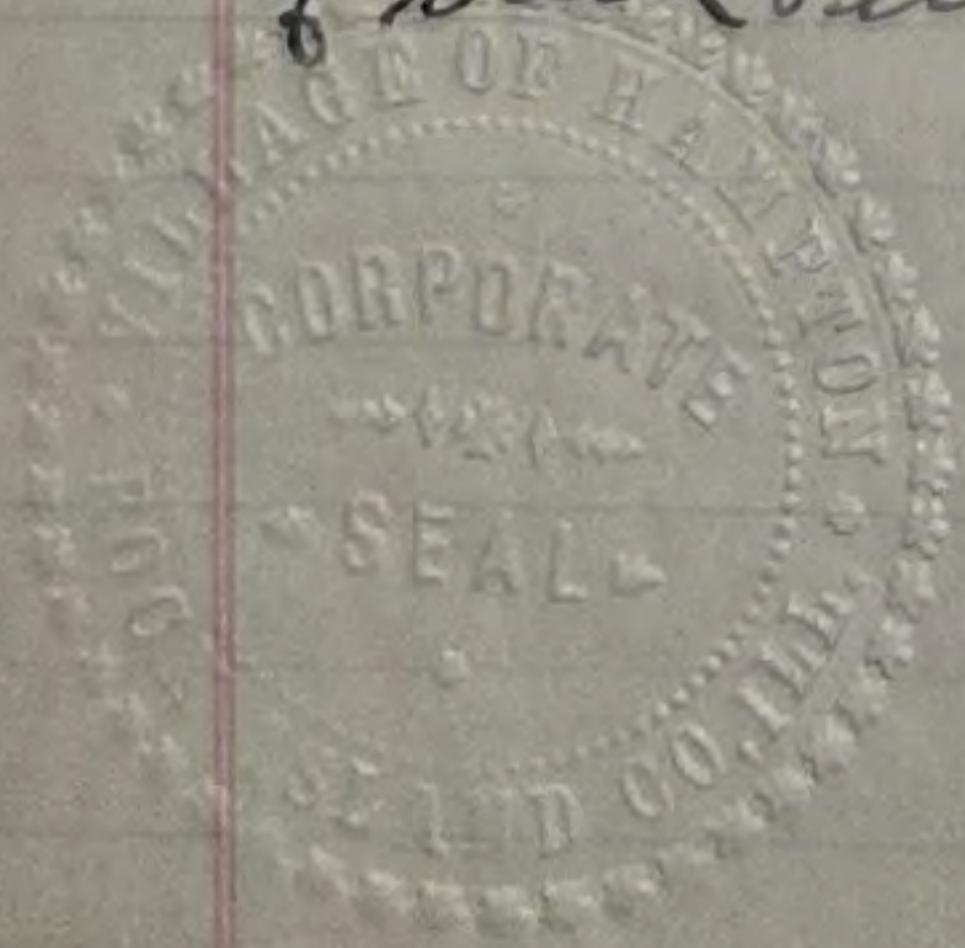

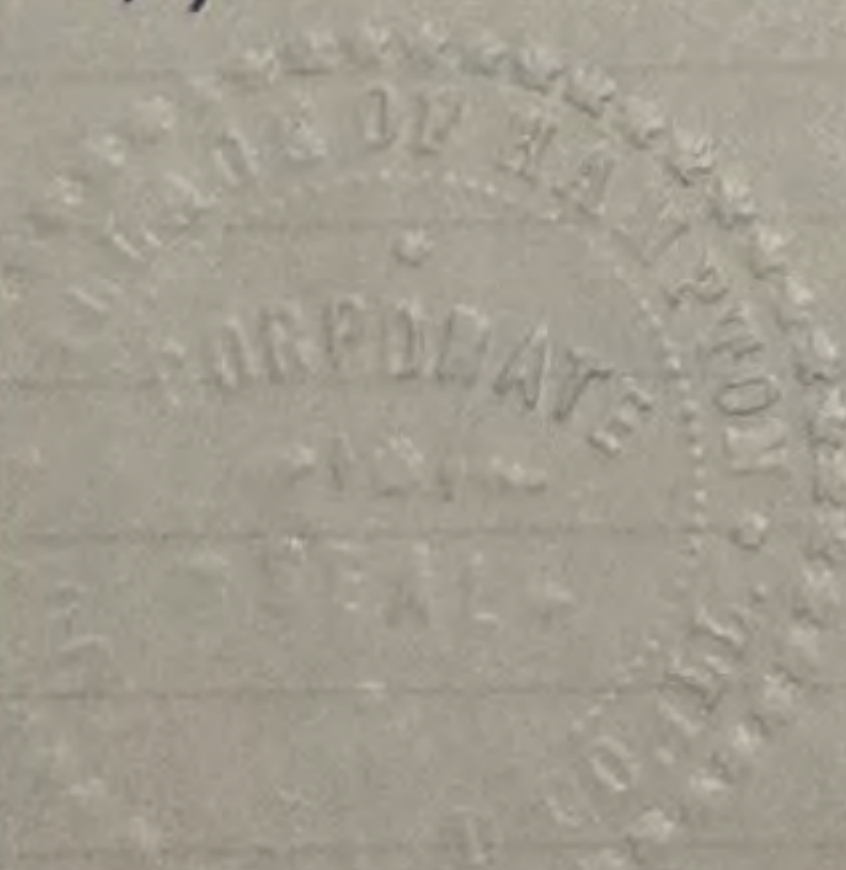



"Ordinance No. 146"

An Ordinance To Regulate The Sale of Alcoholic Liquor in the Village of Hampton, County of Rock Island and State of Illinois, Be it Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hampton, County of Rock Island and State of Illinois that:

1. Definitions, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms as used in this ordinance shall be construed according to the definitions given below.
 - Alcoholic liquor - any spirits, wine, beer, ale, or other liquid containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume, which is fit for beverage purposes.
 - Retail Sale - the sale for use or consumption and not for resale.
 - Restaurant - any Public ^{place} kept, used, maintained, advertised and held out to the public as a place where meals are served, and where meals are actually and regularly served, without sleeping accommodations, such space being provided with adequate and sanitary kitchen and dining room equipment and capacity and having employed therein a sufficient number and kind of employees, cook and serve suitable food for its guests.
2. License required. It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail in the Village any alcoholic liquor without having a retail liquor dealer's license, or in violation of the terms of such license.
3. Applications. Application for such license shall be made to the Village President in writing, signed by the applicant, if an individual, or by a duly authorized agent thereof, if a corporation, verified by

oath or affidavit, and shall contain the following information and statements:

- (1) The name, age, and address of the applicant in the case of an individual, in the case of a Co-Partnership, the person entitled to share in the profits thereof, and in the case of a Corporation for Profit, the date of incorporation, the object for which it was organized, the names and addresses of the officers and directors, and if a majority in interest of the stock of such Corporation is owned by one person or his nominee, the name and address of such person.
- (2) The citizenship of the applicant, his place of birth and if a naturalized citizen, the time and place of his naturalization;
- (3) The character of business of the applicant; and in case of a Corporation, the object for which it was formed;
- (4) The length of time that said applicant has been in business of that character, or in the case of a Corporation, the date on which its charter was issued;
- (5) The amount of goods, wares and merchandise on hand at the time application is made;
- (6) The location and description of the premises or place of business which is to be operated under such license;
- (7) a statement whether applicant has made similar application for a similar other license on premises other than described in this application, and the disposition of such application;
- (8) a statement that applicant has never been convicted of a felony and is not disqualified to receive a license by reason of any matter or thing contained in this ordinance, laws of this State, or the ordinances of this Village;

- (9) whether a previous license by any state or subdivision thereof or by the federal government has been revoked, and the reason thereof.
- (10) a statement that the applicant will not violate any of the laws of the state of Illinois or of the United States, or any ordinance of the Village in the conduct of his place of business.
4. Restrictions on licenses. No such license shall be issued to:
- (1) a person who is not a resident of the Village;
 - (2) a person who is not of good character and reputation in the community in which he resides;
 - (3) a person who is not a citizen of the United States;
 - (4) a person who has been convicted of a felony under the laws of the state of Illinois;
 - (5) a person who has been convicted of being the keeper or is keeping a house of ill fame;
 - (6) a person who has been convicted of pandering or other crime or misdemeanor opposed to decency and morality;
 - (7) a person whose license under this ordinance has been ~~revoked~~ revoked for cause;
 - (8) a person who at the time of application for renewal of any license issued hereunder would not be eligible for such license upon a first application;
 - (9) a Co-partnership, unless all the members of such Co-partnership shall be qualified to obtain a license;
 - (10) a Corporation, if any officer, manager or director thereof, or any stockholder or stockholders owning in the aggregate more than five per cent (5%) of the stock of such Corporation, would not be eligible to receive a license hereunder for any reason other than citizenship and residence within the Political Sub-division;

- (11) a person whose place of business is conducted by a manager or agent unless said manager or agent possesses the same qualifications required of the licensee;
- (12) a person who has been convicted of a violation of any Federal or State law concerning the manufacture, possession or sale of alcoholic liquors, subsequent to the passage of this ordinance, or shall have forfeited his bond to appear in Court to answer charges for any such violation.
- (13) a person who does ^{not} own the premises for which a license is sought, or does not have a lease thereon for the full period for which the license is to be issued.
- (14) any law enforcing Public official, any Mayor, Alderman, or member of the City Council or Commission, any President of the Village board of trustees, any member of a Village board of trustees, or any President or member of a County board; and no such official shall be interested in any way, either directly or indirectly, in the manufacture, sale or distribution of alcoholic liquor.
- (15) any persons, association, or corporation not eligible for a State retail liquor dealer's license.

5. Term - pro-rating fee. Each such license shall terminate on the 30th day of April next following its issuance. The fee to be shall be reduced in proportion to the full calendar months which have expired in the year prior to the issuance of the license.

For a license issued on or after the first day of May, 1934 the license fee shall be one-half of the amount specified for a license under this ordinance but there shall be no further fractional division of the license fees payable under

this ordinance. after the licenses are annual licenses, all license fees shall be payable in semi-annual installments in advance on or before the first day of May and the first day of November, 1934 and thereafter annually before the first day of May in each year.

6. Classification - fees. Such licenses shall be in one class as follows to wit:

Class A licenses, which shall authorize the retail sale on the premises specified of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises as well as other retail sales of such liquor. The annual fee for such license shall be One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Disposition of fees. All such fees shall be paid to the President at the time application is made, and shall be forthwith turned over to the treasurer. In the event the license applied for is denied, the fee shall be returned to the applicant; if the license is granted, then the fee shall be deposited in the general corporate fund or in such other fund as shall have been designated by the Board of Trustees, by proper action.

8. List. The President shall keep or cause to be kept a complete record of ^{all} such licenses issued by him; and shall furnish the Clerk, Treasurer, and Chief of Police each with a copy thereof; upon the issuance of any new license, or the revocation of any old license, the President shall give written notice of such action to each of these officers within forty-eight (48) hours of such action.

9. Transfer of license. A license shall be purely a personal privilege, good for not to exceed one year after issuance unless sooner revoked ⁱⁿ as this ordinance provided, and shall not constitute property, nor shall it be subject to attachment, garnishment or execution,

nor shall it be alienable or transferable, voluntarily or involuntarily, or subject to being encumbered or hypothecated. Such license shall not descend by the laws of testate or intestate devolution, but it shall cease upon the death of the licensee, provided that executors or administrators of the estate of any deceased licensee, and the trustee of any insolvent or bankrupt licensee, when such estate consists in part of alcoholic liquors, may continue the business of the sale or manufacture of alcoholic liquors under the order of the appropriate Court, and may exercise the privileges of the deceased or insolvent or bankrupt licensee after the death of such decedent, or such insolvency or bankruptcy until the expiration of such license but not longer than six months after the death, bankruptcy or insolvency of such licensee. A refund shall be made of that portion of the license fees paid for any period in which the licensee shall be prevented from operating under such license in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph. Any licensee may renew his license at the expiration thereof, provided he is then qualified to receive a license and the premises for which such renewal license is sought are suitable for such purpose; and, provided, further, that the renewal privilege herein provided for shall not be construed as a vested right which shall in any case prevent the President from decreasing the number of licenses to be issued within his jurisdiction.

10. Change of location. a retail liquor dealer's license shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor only in the premises described in the application and license.

such location may be changed only upon the written permit to make such change issued by the President. No change of location shall be permitted unless the proposed new location is a proper one for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor under the law of this state and the ordinances of the Village.

11. Peddling. It shall be unlawful to peddle alcoholic liquor in the Village.
12. Sanitary Conditions. All premises used for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor, or for the storage of such liquor for such sale, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and shall be kept in full compliance with the ordinances regulating the conditions of premises used for the storage or sale of food for human consumption.
13. Employees. It shall be unlawful to employ in any premises used for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor any person who is afflicted with, or who is a carrier of, any contagious, infectious or venereal disease; and it shall be unlawful for any person who is afflicted with or a carrier of any such disease to work in or about any premises or to engage in any way in the handling, preparation or distribution of such liquor.
14. Restricted Areas. It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale at retail any alcoholic liquor within any such portion of the Village unless the owner or owners of at least two-thirds of the frontage feet along the street and streets adjacent to such place of business for which a license is sought, for a distance of 200 feet in each direction from such proposed place of business, shall file with the local liquor Commissioner, or licensing

officer, his or their written consent to the use of such place for the sale of alcoholic liquors.

15.

Location restrictions. No license shall be issued for the sale at retail of any alcoholic liquor within 100 feet of any Church, School, hospital, home for aged or indigent persons or for Veterans, their wives or children or any military or naval station; Provided, that this prohibition shall not apply to hotels offering restaurant service, regularly organized clubs, or to restaurants, food shops or other places where sale of alcoholic liquor is not the principal business carried on, if such place of business so exempted shall have been established for such purposes prior to the taking effect of this ordinance. No person shall hereafter engage in business as a retailer of any alcoholic liquor within 100 feet of any undertaking establishment or mortuary.

Opening and closing hours. No person licensed to sell alcoholic liquor under this ordinance shall permit his establishment to be open for the sale of such liquor between the hour of 12:00 o'clock midnight and 6:00 o'clock A.M. of any day of the week except on Sunday when the establishment shall remain closed from 1:00 o'clock A.M. until 12: noon of said day.

It shall be unlawful to keep open for business or to admit the public to any premises in or on which alcoholic liquor is sold at retail during the hours within which the sale of such liquor is prohibited; Provided, that in the case of restaurants, such establishments may be kept open during such hours, but no alcoholic liquor may be sold to or consumed by the

- Public during such hours.
17. Election days. No person shall sell at retail any alcoholic liquor on the day of any National, State, County or Municipal election, including Primary elections, during the hours to which are open, within the Political Area in which such election is being held.
18. View from Street. In premises upon which the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption upon the premises is licensed, no screen, blind, curtain, partition, article or thing shall be permitted in the windows or upon the doors of such licensed premises nor inside such premises, which shall prevent a clear view into the interior of such licensed premises from the street, road or sidewalk at all times, and no booth, screen, partition, or other obstruction nor any arrangement of lights or lighting shall be permitted in or about the interior of such premises which shall prevent a full view of the entire interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk, and said premises must be so located that there shall be full view of the entire interior of such premises from the street, road or sidewalk. All rooms where liquor is sold for consumption upon the premises shall be continuously lighted during business hours by natural light or artificial white light so that all parts of the interior of the premises shall be clearly visible. In case the view into any such licensed premises required by the foregoing provisions, shall be wilfully obscured by the licensee

or by him wilfully suffered to be obscured or in any manner obstructed, then such license shall be subject to revocation in the manner herein provided. In order to enforce the provisions of this section, the President shall have the right to require the filing with him of plans, drawings and photographs showing the clearance of the view as above required.

19. Revocation. The President may revoke any retail liquor dealer's license for any violation of any provision of this ordinance, or for any violation of any state law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic liquor.
20. Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
21. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

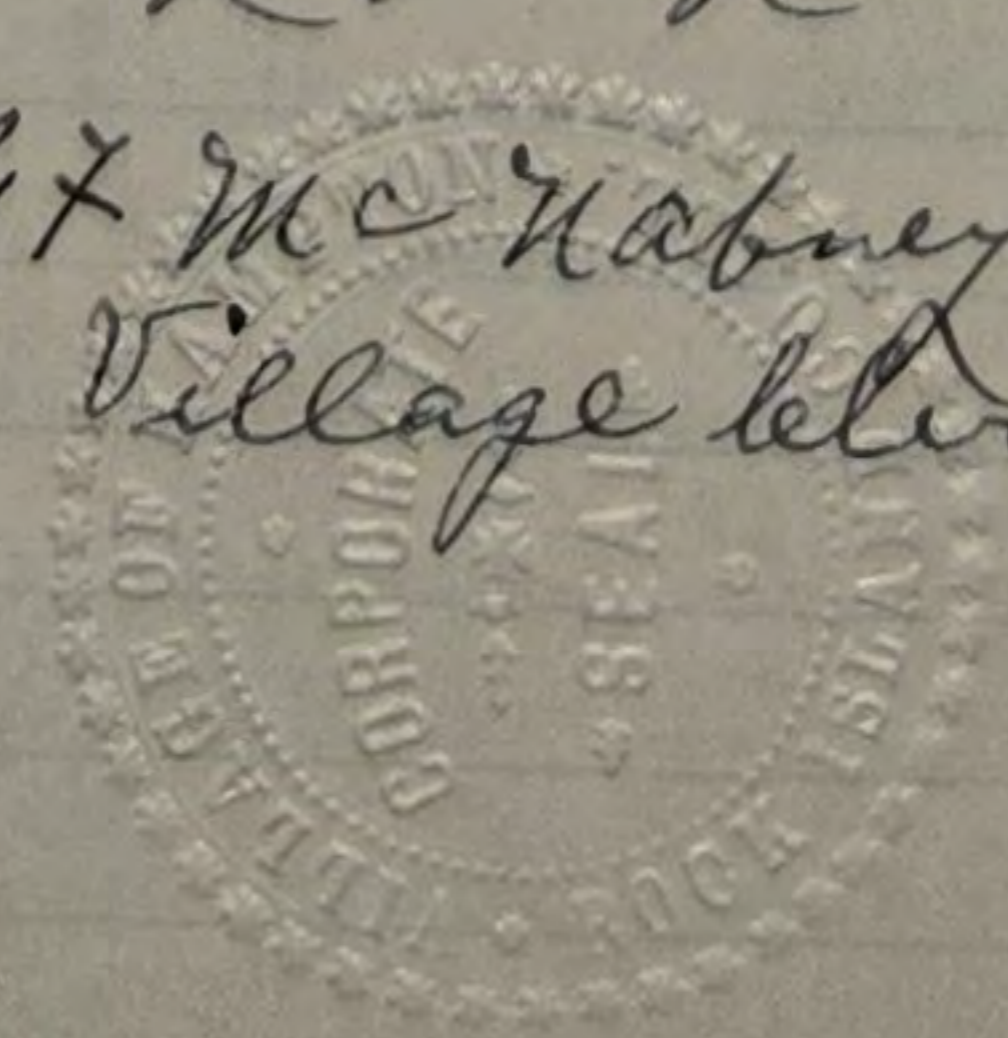

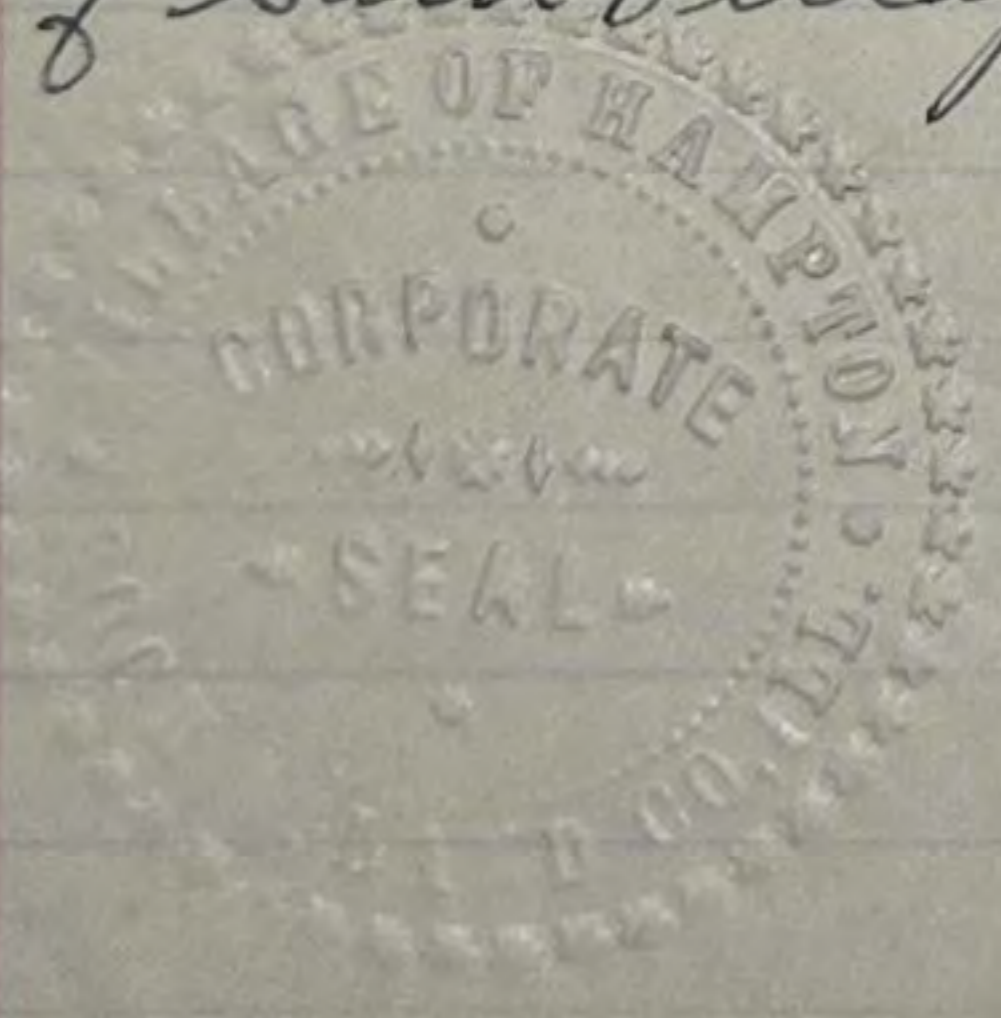
