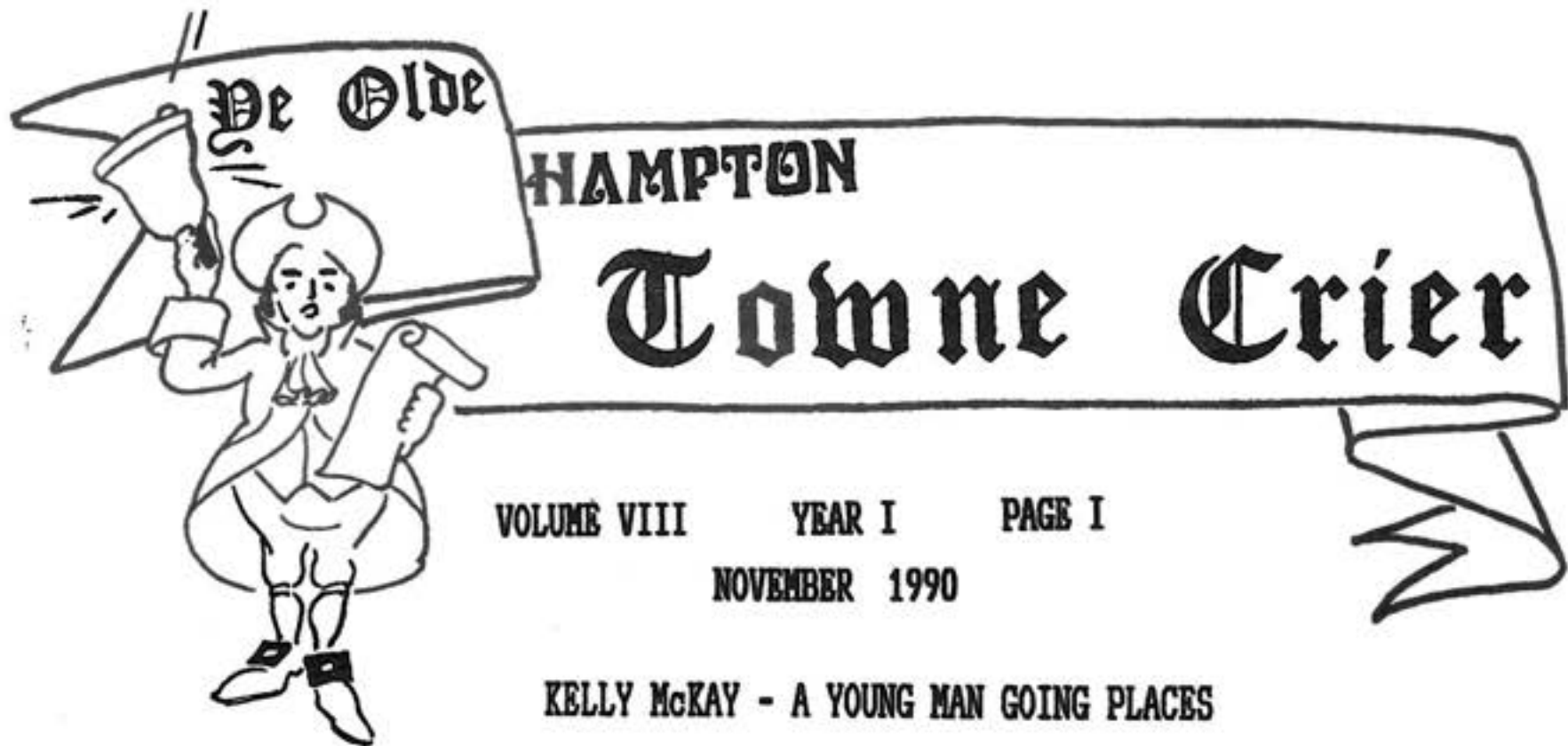

ornithology, the study of birds. He has also filled his summers with additional studies at Black Hawk and Augustana. Right now he is working on his Masters degree at Western Illinois University. His thesis involved a 2 year study of wintering bald eagles in the Quad City area. His advisor at Western is Dr. Thomas Dunstan another well recognized authority on the bald eagles.

The young man also takes a legal approach to the subject researching the governmental laws that are there for the protection of wildlife and concerning himself with laws that should be enacted. He becomes concerned over the governments opening of pristine land over the last decade to multiple use projects of farming, grazing, mining and logging which encroaches on the small amount of land left to wildlife and which leaves it barren. At Western, Kelly has had a great deal experience in handling birds of the wild through a program called Raptor Rehabilitation Program (Raptor means birds of prey). Most of the birds in the program are those that have been injured by man in some way. They see a lot of broken wings by the bird having been hit with an automobile. When they rehabilitate a bird, it goes back into the wild if at all possible. Occasionally, say if the wing has been amputated, it will have to be kept in captivity at zoos. Kelly has worked at our own Niabi Zoo in the summer putting into practice his years of learning.

Our best wishes to this young man as he takes on a serious responsibility for the rest of us.

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CONTEL CLARIFIES "EMERGENCY" CALLS

Contel Representative, Mary Beth Sanders, attended a recent board meeting and shared with us that things looked favorable from an internal standpoint that the merger would be going through. She also passed out information on the new rates that, if approved by the ICC, would be effective in January. Board members expressed concern that persons with the 496 prefix would then find it long distance to call the school, village hall, fire department, doctors (since we do not have an MD in the village) and other emergency numbers. Ms. Sanders checked with her superiors and they said something could be worked out with the village to accommodate "emergency" calls.

I called Ms. Sanders to see just how this would work so that a person would not be billed unnecessarily. It seems that Contel was not aware that Hampton was linked with 911. Since we have the 911 service, they now cannot see where any other call would be considered "emergency". A sick kid is not necessarily an "emergency" just to call the doctor or school. Unless the village board comes up with any ideas to the contrary, there will be no free gratis to call the school, etc. for 496 persons.

I don't know about you but I'm not going to be a "happy camper" when I hear: "Good Morning. This is such and such a place. Can your hold - click!" while they talk to someone else & I pay per minute because they either have call forwarding or several lines coming into the office. I'm also not going to like paying for all those dumb recordings and I doubt if many will be returned when they have to pay the per call/per minute fee.

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RECIPE-of-the-MONTH

Seafood Lighthouse



Ingredients

2 Tbl. Herb Butter
1 each Lobster Tail (4-5 oz. split in half)
6 each scallops
6 each Shrimp (shell on)
6 oz. White Fish (cut in half)
6 oz. Crab Legs (cracked or split)
2 Cup Mushrooms, sliced
1/2 Cup Scallions
1 oz. Brandy (or dry White Wine)

Directions

1. Melt herbs and butter in skillet. Add lobster. Slowly saute lobster about 5 minutes or until meat is firm. Turn flame to high and add all seafood, continue to saute until all seafood is firm. Add mushrooms and scallion and saute a few more minutes. Add brandy and flame. Reduce liquid by 1/3 and serve.
