CELEBRATING 40 YEARS IN BUSINESS - McKAY PLATING

1991 BRINGS ANOTHER MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY TO ONE OF THE LONGEST, OPERATING BUSINESSES IN HAMPTON. Congratulations go to *PETE & HELEN McKAY* for the successful enterprise that has fared well under the industrial slowdown of the area.

Here's a personality close-up that just has to include both the husband and wife. It amazes me to find a husband/wife team that can live together and work together for 40 years (including 50 yrs. of marriage) and still be around to tell about it.

Many of the "little" (or not so little) things they have done for the community will never be found out by any one source. We do know, however, that they sponsor Hampton baseball teams, donate to the local events, and support practically every half-baked idea (including the Towne Crier) of village interest. Fifteen years ago Pete and Helen established an annual Scholarship Grant for

continued education to a graduating high school student who also went to Hampton. In years past the McKays provided the fireworks at the old 4th of July town doings. To commemorate our Country's 200 anniversary they had Hampton artist, Charlie Howell paint the mural on the side of the building. As appreciation, in 1978 the Village of Hampton gave the *Hampton Citizen Award for Devoted Community Service* to Pete as a small token for the support he gives to the community.

Back in '51, plating was just a hobby to Pete who fooled around with it in his garage. Today, the McKay Plating Co. has grown to one of the largest job shops in the area.

Currently nine McKays work in the plant; they employ 28. In addition to Helen & Pete (who now spends most of his time managing

Some Cedar Brook residents have approached the village for information on annexation. Being strictly preliminary feelers to have in hand information on such matters of whether there might be a change in taxes plus or minus, garbage pick-up, library district, etc., let others from the subdivision know that this is just at the consideration stage and is a good time to find out what is going on. One thing to realize is that school districts are not effected by this process.

The Hampton Riverfront Development project at the old quarry will soon be getting underway.

Before we had to take the Crier to the printers, 3 persons had filed for the 3 village trustee positions available. They were Bill Francis and incumbents, Jeanne McKay and Kenny Wright. In addition, Denny Miller has taken an application out and will probably have it returned by the deadline. Any others will have to wage a write-in campaign. (The last caucus for the Progressive Party was held on January 7th. There were no nominations from the floor. As one villager put it, "it was like losing a little bit of Americana". The caucus is an old, nostalgic system that has probably been replaced by a fairer process.)

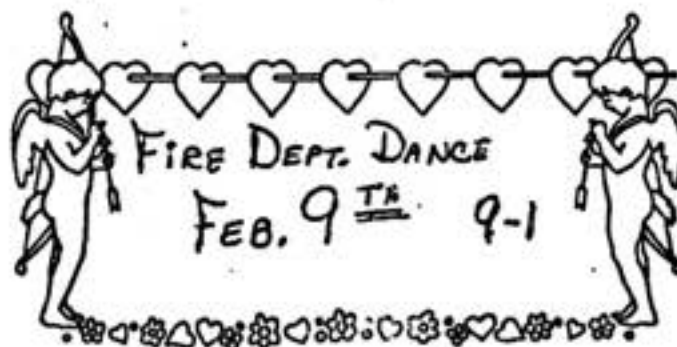

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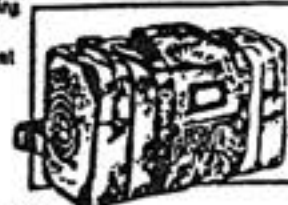

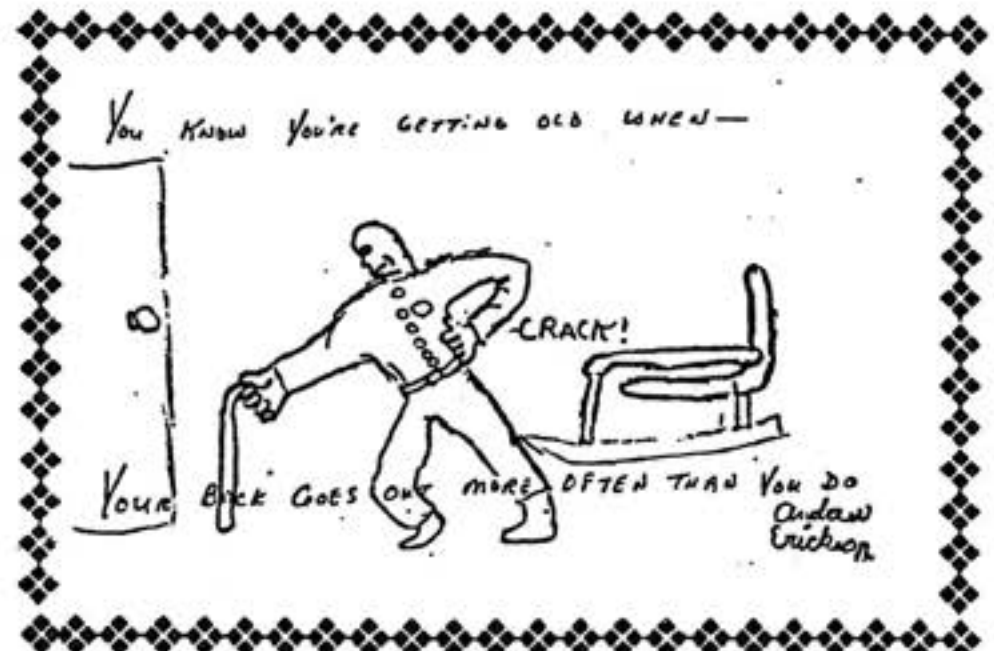

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QUAD CITY CONSERVATION ALLIANCE

The QCCA is a coalition of nine conservation groups on both sides of the river. This is a non-profit organization whose earnings are all geared to conservation projects. A few years back they received the old Rock Island Millworks as a donation from its heir. The facility has been known as the RIMCO Center. In the last four years they were able to turn back to the community, via various conservation projects, over \$100,000 through the rental of this Center. At one point the center might have been considered a liability due to its condition but the clubs have worked at restoring the building and it is now a fine facility. Renovation is not complete however, the ambitious Alliance has taken on a tremendous job to make this a real attraction by demolishing portions of the old manufacturing site and adding an auditorium and meeting rooms to the current exhibition hall. Future plans for the newly named QCCA Expo Center also include a conservatory and a great deal of on-site parking. Already the third largest convention center in Illinois (the first two being the McCormick Place & O'Hare Expo Center in the Chicago area), the QCCA Expo Center will be a welcome attraction for tourism.
