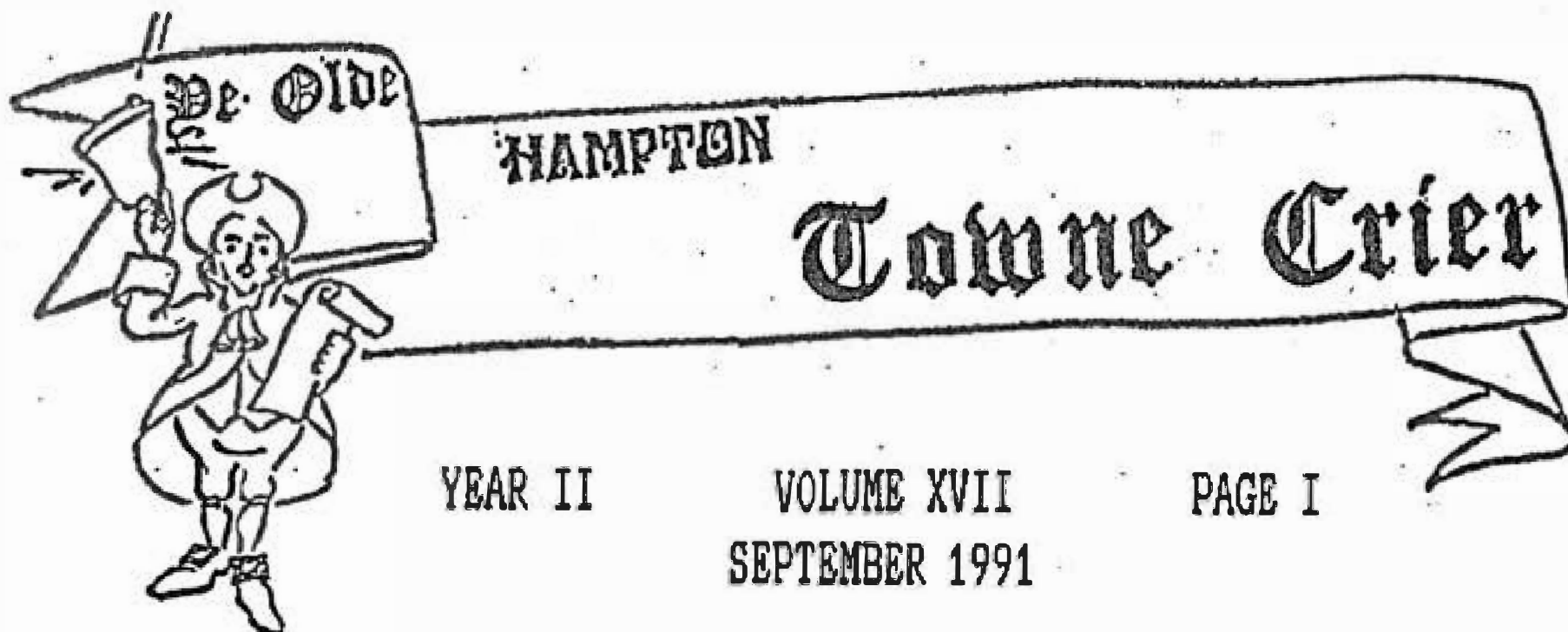




PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION - THE HEART OF THE SCHOOL SYSTEM

We give *backbone* and *brains* over to the educators, but without question, PTA is the heart of the school. These hard-working members provide many extras that would not exist otherwise. They annually budget some \$5,000 to the school. Recent purchases have been the last 2 photocopiers, a laminating machine, a book binder, and blinds for the class rooms. Each year the teachers make out a 'wish list' of items that do not fit in the school budget. The PTA tries to fill those needs as best they can. In addition to purchases, the PTA gives a \$800 scholarship each year to a Hampton graduate entering college. They sponsor the Cultural Arts Program (bringing professional artists/musicians to the school). They donate to the 8th grade field trip and provide the 8th grade shirts; and pay for the buses for each class to take a field trip. The PTA provides the games and treats for the Halloween party & parade, and the Christmas (Santa visits grades K -5), Valentine Day, and Easter parties. And the PTA gives an Appreciation Dinner to the staff once a year.

Primary fund-raisers for the organization are the ever popular *Carnival*, the Book Fair, Santa's Workshop, Hot Lunches, and for the last 4 years the Pizza Sales (this year Pizza monies will be earmarked toward new stage curtains).

Room Mothers carry a lot of the load calling for help whenever needed (desserts for hot lunch, help at parties and the carnival, etc.) PTA supports a *good behavior program* for K-5 grades. At the end of each period, the classes that earned it

have a party or get to do something special like making a craft item.

PTA Open House will be held on Thurs., Sept. 26th at 6:30. Don't be scared off from joining PTA because you can't devote the time you think is needed. Your show of support is just as important. Most of the \$2.00 membership fee goes to State & National levels to support legislation for the improvement of the educational system. Regardless of whether you join PTA or not, they do wish you to pick up a '91-'92 yearbook because it will advise you of events within the school.

LIFE MEMBER AWARDS are given yearly to a person who has worked exceptionally hard for the welfare of the children. Their efforts encompass events in and out of the school to the entire community. Last year this award was granted to Mary Jane Duke. Previous members are Pat Johnson-90, Sharon Brooks-89, JoEllen Bacorn-88, Mickey Kindhart-87, Lee Hanseemann-86, Margaret Engemann-86, Marcia Katzenburger-84, Millie Mason-83, Ann Beckman-82, Sharon Whitney-81, Sharon DeBo-80.

The PTA also has a "Book of Recognition" to honor persons who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to assist PTA in their efforts. This is given with no particular regularity. Recent awards were given to Gerry Walker-'89, Chris Sederstrom-87, Sharon Witney-85, and Millie Mason-83.

PTA was started in Hampton in 1949 by Olive Weissman who was its first president and over the years there has only been one father to hold the office, Louie Sonnevile. This year's president is Mary Verdick.

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PRAYER

A book that has been a great blessing to me is entitled Quiet Talks on Prayer by S.D. Gordon. It is an old book but still very relevant. He said, "The great people of the earth are the people who pray. I do not mean those who talk about prayer, nor those who say they believe in prayer, nor yet those again who can explain about prayer, but I mean those who take time to pray. They do not have time. It must be taken from something else. This something else is important - very important and pressing, but still less important and pressing than prayer."

Whenever you pray you need to keep three basic facts in mind:

1) Remember God's greatness. The greatest impossibilities come within range when we rest our faith on the reality of God's greatness. Sidney Lanier wrote a poem entitled The Marshes of Glynn in which he wrote: "As the marsh here secretly builds on the watery sod, I will build me a nest on the greatness of God. By so many roots as the marsh grass sends in the sod; I will heartily lay me ahold on the greatness of God." Read and meditate on Psalm 145, the theme of which is the greatness of God.

2) Intersperse your petitions to God liberally with praise. Praise reveals a grateful heart. As someone has said, "The grateful heart distinguishes those who love God from magicians who would merely use Him."

Both Les and Marilyn say "Quality Service will be the driving force of the Century 21 organization and of our office

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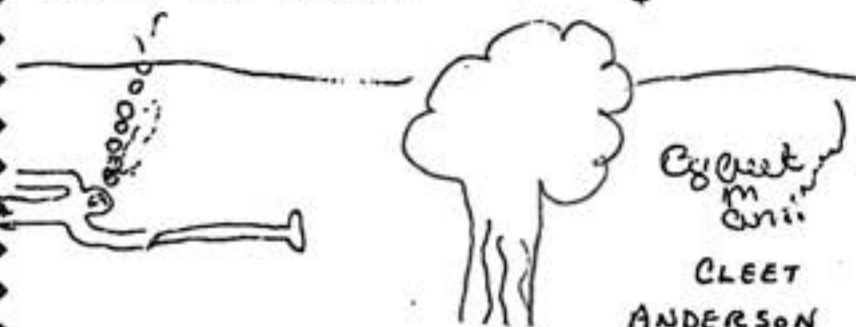
