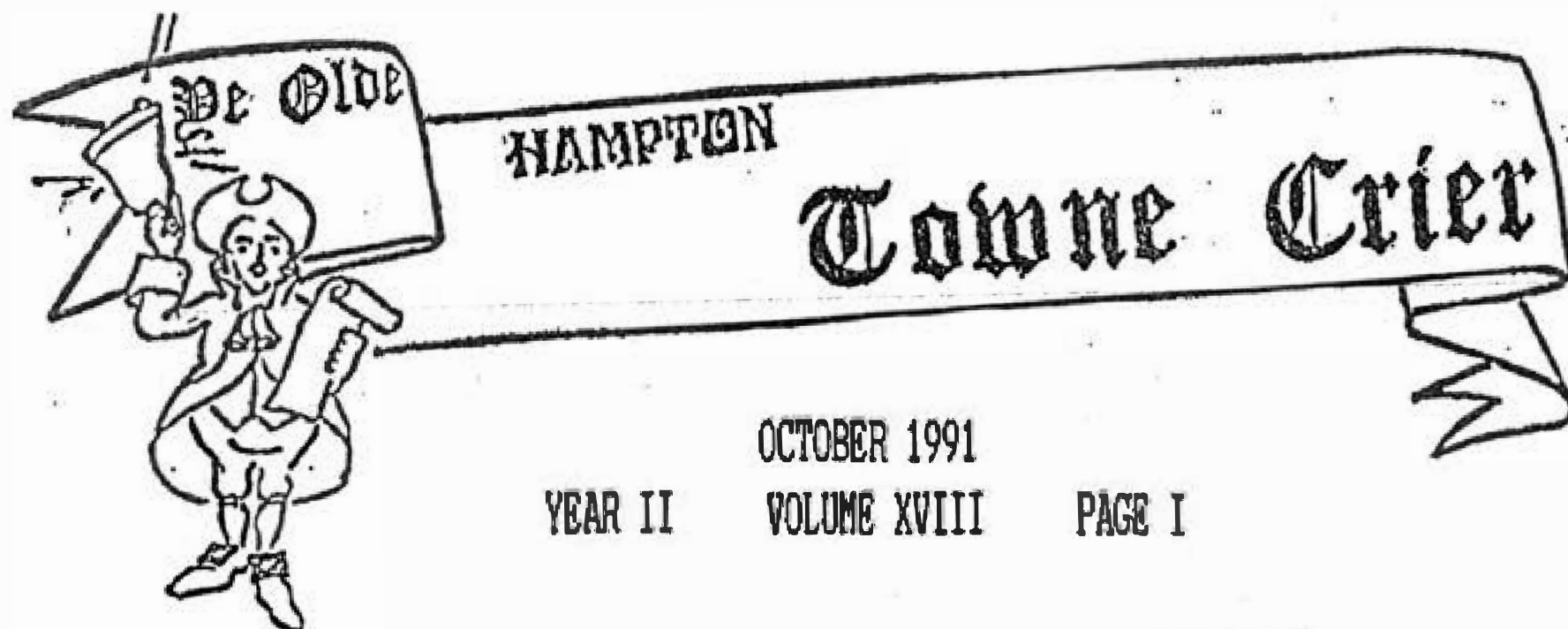




ONE LOCATION - TWO OPERATIONS - THREE GENERATIONS

Hampton can boast several such family businesses. What an atmosphere for a 'Mom and Pop business' to grow with the changing needs of the family.

Frazier Lawn & Garden started out as a fluke in '69 when Tom wanted a riding mower to make mowing their huge lawn easier. He felt guilty about the initial expense and decided to justify the purchase by cutting a few other lawns. It got out of hand and Tom quit his job at Deere Harvester in '72 to develop the lawn care service. Sandy took courses through an extension program with the University of Ill. in horticulture and landscape design.

In true Frazier style (the family is a unit) the kids have all pitched in with the duties and all through osmosis absorbed lawn care. When son, TOM (they are not Jr. & Sr.) graduated from high school, the single venture evolved into two separate businesses. The Old Man (as the crews call father Tom to tell them apart) went into Tom's Small Engine Repair and TOM took over the lawn care. Again, they went back to school to keep up with the trades. Notably, TOM studied chemicals and their

effects and Tom has to yearly keep up on changes with mechanics and electronic fuel injection. The repairs of gas engines soon grew to equipment sales and the lawn care added snow plowing to keep operating year'round. They have both commercial and private accounts boasting many for the full length of the business. Sandy still helps with landscaping designs. She particularly enjoys planning the shrubs and plants to flower at different times as the seasons evolve.

They answer all calls personally (755-7870) and do not chance an answering machine goof-up. The shop itself is open from 8-5:30 weekdays and from 8-3 on Sat.

On January 11, Tom and Sandy will have been married for 35 years and been in their present location for all but 6 months of the time. Over the years they have altered the original design of the home to accommodate their changing needs.

Tom is a native Hamptonian having actually been born in the family home. Sister Florence McKay-Arterberry currently

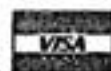

16- COLLISION REPAIR CENTER HAS NEW LOCATION!

As of October 14th, Collision Repair Center (CRC) will be located in the old Rexroat building at 1200 42nd Ave., East Moline. The newly decorated 22,000 sq. ft. will house the latest state-of-the-art technology in auto service and repair.

I was privileged to receive a well explained, walking tour of the establishment. The one thing that impressed me the most was how environmentally sound the operation is. Myron Hazen, owner/operator of the business considered the well being of his employees, the community, and the two restaurants located on either side of him when purchasing equipment. He commented that you don't see many *old* auto mechanics. They work elbow deep in solvents, breath fumes and dust, and often work unsafely without proper equipment.

Myron will have four sanding prep. stations where the air is circulated and filtered. He purchased the latest BINKS Surround Air paint booth with a separate paint mixing room. Both are completely computer controlled, recirculating and filtering the air continually. All waste products (oil, antifreeze, paint, thinners, etc) are sent to recycling plants and are put to efficient reuse in other products. There is a separate room for changing and repairing tires with a new machine that will not harm the paint or chrome on your rim. Another room houses the frame department where they will work on solid and uni-body structures. Two computerized machines equipped with lasers will speed repairs. With models and makes of cars having such diverse engineering, CRC does have to stay on top of all changes to maintain the less than 3 millimeter tolerance, stress factors, and even know heat limits of various metals to maintain strength in the frame. CRC does everything from simple oil changes, mufflers, shocks, brakes, to complete body work and window replacement. Although they do transmission and engine work, the only thing they do *not* do in the shop is complete overhauling of motors and transmissions.

CRC will have two estimators on hand for minimum waiting and will provide two *private* rooms for people to confer with their insurance adjusters. Also for the convenience of the customer, Myron has a comfortable waiting area with a phone and

observation windows, a safe playroom, and a changing station in the public restrooms. There will be a Retail Sales Dept. for parts and accessories.

Watch for information on the GRAND OPENING in our November paper. Guys and gals will both want to tour. At last an auto shop where a woman can feel welcome!

Currently CRC employs 11 people. Within a year, they hope to increase that to from 17-23. Mr. Hazen's has some innovative goals on the horizon with a *drive-thru* for estimates, 3 estimators and a full time detail man in immediate sight.

And what you really want to know, who is Myron Hazen? Well, I was impressed! He is very personable and considerate. As a goals person myself, I found Myron to be the most highly-oriented, goals person I have ever run across. He is a step-by-step, in-its-own-time kind of guy. 27 years ago he started out sweeping floors in an auto body shop and the idea formed. He nurtured it over the years and in 1980 he opened Quality Control Auto Body, 1615 18th Ave., East Moline. He still owns the firm with a manager running the operation. Then in '84 he purchased Thompson's in Silvis where CRC is currently housed. In '86 he bought the lot behind and expanded. The new location on 42nd Ave. has been in the planning stages for 14 months.

Up to about ten years ago, Myron raced cars and motorcycles. Today his interests include boating, snowmobiling and playing pool. The *guys* at CRC are on a pool team. Myron frequently hosts Christmas parties for the families and they have had 10 annual *stag* boating/picnics. I got the distinct feeling he likes and cares about his employees.

Myron has 3 children. Todd William is 23 and works at Illini Hospital in the computer dept. He is an Augie graduate. Kimberly Dawn, 21 currently works 3 jobs at the Old Oaks, Holiday Inn and South Park Travel. At 16 Nicole Renae is a sophomore at Rockridge H.S. and loves horses and is involved in 4-H.

I asked Mr. Hazen his experience with seat belts since he deals with the accident end. "*Definitely use them!* Most accidents are under 30 MPH and, even at those reduced speeds, seat belts save lives!" he says. "The best thing is the air bag, however."
