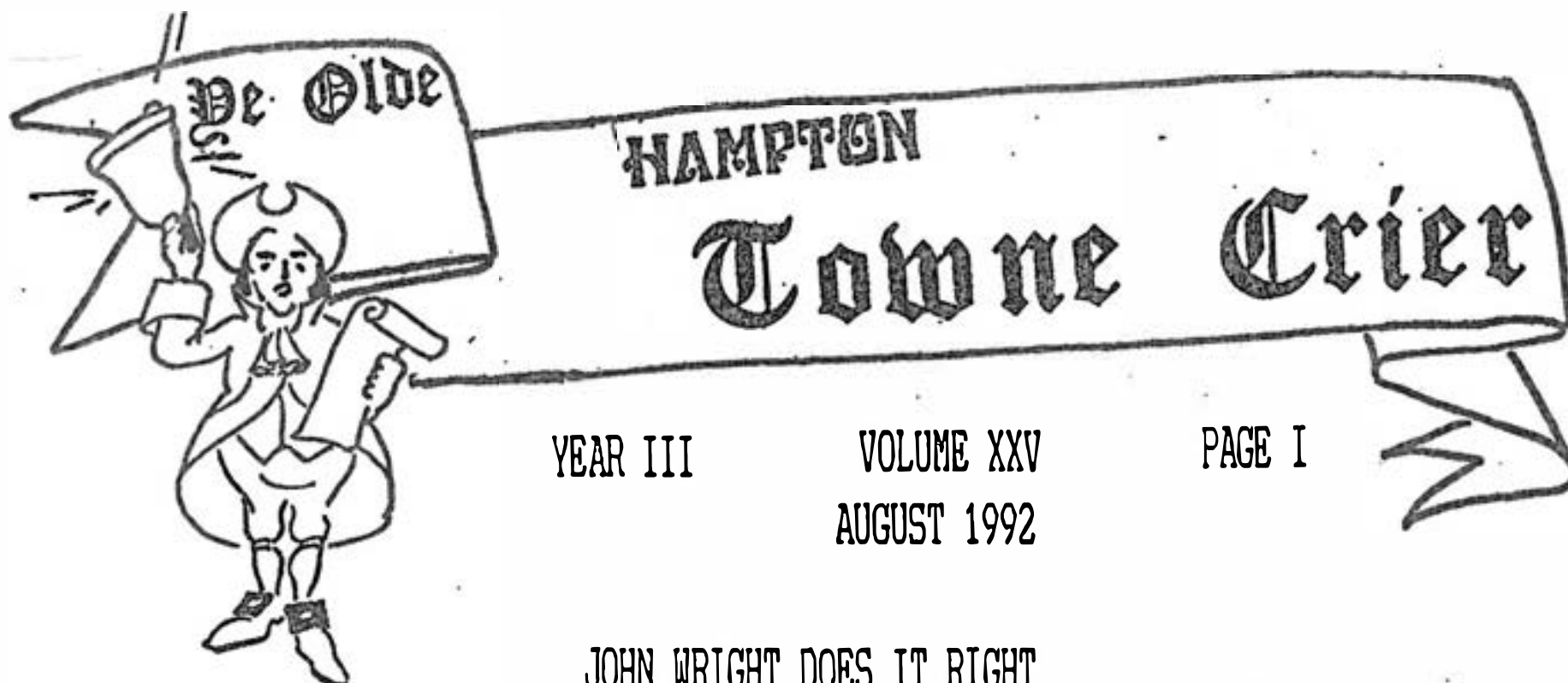




JOHN WRIGHT DOES IT RIGHT

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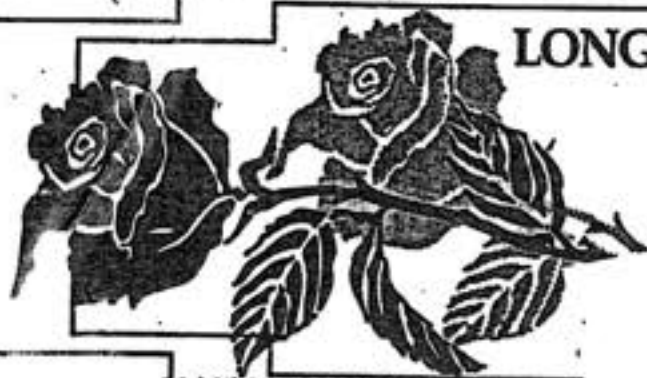
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VILLAGE BULLETIN BOARD

VILLAGE BOARD MEETINGS

I did try to attend most of the board meetings and a few committee meetings over the last two months. This report is just a summary of what has taken place.

It was mentioned that the garbage service is now under County Waste. See full article elsewhere.

Coverage from the Dispatch and Times has been slow to get into print and there are time when the papers do not even send a reporter to the board meetings. The board will press the issue.

Village Attorney Graham Lee drew up the ordinance to eliminate the one-ways in town. Anyone interested in being on the Zoning Board or on the board for the T.I.F. districting please notify the Village Hall 755-7165.

After going through the bidding requirements, hopes are that the repairs to the Village Hall will soon be underway.

Plans for the Village Auction are still not finalized. Officials are checking with other area towns to see if one 'gigantic All-Cities yard sale' might be formulated.

We would have vehicles, a boat, bikes, etc from the fire and Police departments along with other miscellaneous items.

It was approved for the fire department to keep the old yellow truck and to sell the old red one instead. A larger, better equipped, replacement truck was already put in service last summer. Approval to purchase 6 additional EMT smocks for \$275 was given. With the increased enrollment in the EMT program, the smocks were necessary. A series of 3 hepatitis shots for personnel dealing with emergency medical situations will be completed this summer for a cost not to exceed \$720. Congratulations go to Chief Craig Haig who was awarded "Paramedic of the

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SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

SCHOOL REGISTRATION WILL BE AUGUST 17th from 7am to 11am and from 5pm to 7pm. The Registration fee this year is \$30.00 - bus fees will remain the same as last year. School starts AUGUST 25!

A synopsis of the summer meetings shows that many increases in services have occurred. The school's insurance provider, Horace Mann Ins. Co., increased rates at just under 5% or \$2,714.16 to the district. Pinks Bus Service was awarded a 3% increase in rates. The board did not feel they would need to pass on the increase at this time to the users. In both cases the raises were less than expected.

Due to the raising cost of books over the last several years, the board found it necessary to raise the registration fee to \$30 this year. Families in the low-income bracket can receive assistance. The 'First Day Fund' can also help with start up supplies for the students. Inquire at the school 755-0693.

The board hired Regina Ahern of Silvis as the learning disabilities resource teacher. The board took a walking tour around the building noting that most of the summer repairs had already been completed and suggested a few, small additional items.

With the Carbon Cliff school looking into its options on consolidation, the Hampton School Board is also keeping apprized of what is going on in that area by attending meetings and reviewing informational tapes.

The board hired Tracey Electric to perform the work necessary to meet life-safety code requirements. Included will be installing emergency exit signs and fire alarms.

The low bid was approved at \$4,970. The board also approved payment of our portion to the cost of roof repairs at Black Hawk Area Special Education Building for \$1,246.

Year" by the Illinois Trauma Region II and to Captain Rick Norin for "EMT-I of the Year". And the new air packs do not fit in the truck seats. Permission was given to purchase new seats for \$360.

Interest has been shown again in the village for bus service. A representative from Metro-Link attended one of the meetings and described the new service to Green Rock/Colona and gave some background as to what we would receive for the assessed fee. The board is taking the matter into consideration. Public hearings would be held should it be deemed plausible. Approximate cost to each tax payer would be \$12 on \$30,000 of assessed property value.

The pavilion in the river park is near completion and has already been rented out for the first time to villagers Bobby and Marshall Beals for a family reunion. Electricity and water service is forthcoming. The Parks Committee will be setting up standards for usage. We will advise. The balance of the used stage lumber was swapped to Pete Huber for the steel used on the ceiling of the pavilion. The village came out 2 to 1 on the deal.

A complaint was voiced on the ballgames at Illiniwek being extended beyond the 10pm curfew, that there was an increase in turn-around traffic on the deadend street of north First Ave., and that stripes had not yet been painted on the streets for biker direction. Each matter is being addressed.

We are still waiting for the 404 permit from the Corp so that bids can be put out for the proposed parking and boat ramp in at the river park.

GTE announced they would be lowering rates by \$4 to \$4.50 a month - concern was voiced that they hoped it wouldn't mean a take away of other services.

Thank yous were received from Project Graduation for the donation, and from HYC for the village help and equipment received on improvements required at the ball diamonds in Illiniwek Park.

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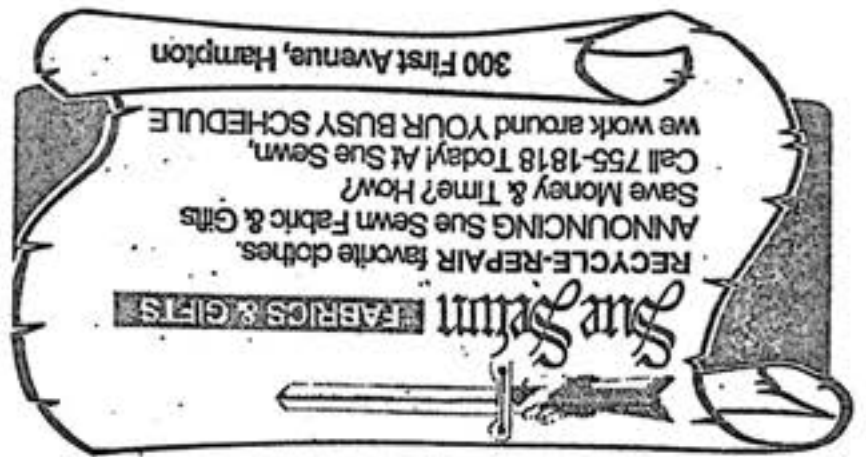

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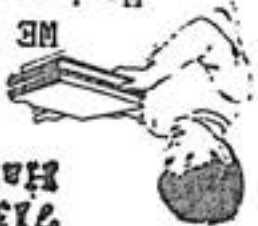

FIRE PROTECTION AND YOUR INSURANCE RATES

We in Hampton enjoy a Fire Protection Rating of a 6 on a scale of 1 to 10 which translates to at least a \$75 savings for the average household. I was recently updating information on our policy so I thought it would be interesting to check out the rating system. The categories are 1-4; 5-8; 9; and 10. The 1-4 group includes Moline, Rock Island & Davenport where they have full time firefighters with short distance service from stations, equipment and training also play factors. Group 5-8 holds Bettendorf & East Moline with a 6 and Silvis who recently fought to obtain a 5 rating. However, the premium remains the same within a grouping. The 9 and the 10 classifications are for small rural towns with lesser equipment and training that have great distance to cover.

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MY "EUROPEAN VACATION"

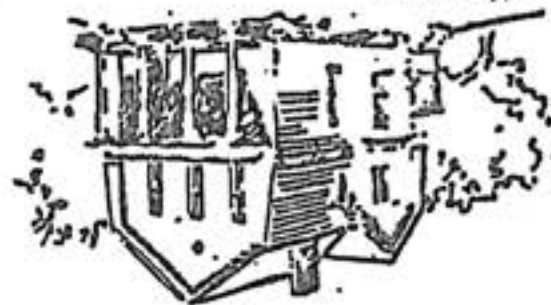

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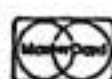
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HAMPTON UNITED METHODIST CHURCH WELCOMES

A representative from Watts attended a village board meeting and gave some background on the company and where they hope to go with the village as far as recycling, grass clippings and rate increases were concerned for the future.

Recycling... is something they are still looking into. We will be informed as to what will be offered when it is worked out - probably in stages.

White Goods... According to the new law, "Starting July 1, 1992 Illinois under the Illinois Environmental Project Act, prohibits the landfilling of 'white goods' unless all components containing 'chloro-fluorocarbon' (CFC) gases, mercury containing switches and 'polychlorinated biphenyls' (PCB) have been removed. This removal must be documented prior to disposal.

Example of white goods include but are not limited to: refrigerators, washers, dryers, air conditioners, light fixtures, furnaces, stoves, electric motors, and other miscellaneous appliances." (They will still pick up 'manageable' items such as chairs, tables, etc.)

Yard Waste... Anyone wishing to have pick-up for their yard waste please contact Village Hall at 755-7165. They need to know who and where the pick ups are needed.

Rates... It has been noted that Hampton has not had a rate increase since 1980 and is only paying \$3.50 a household. The new firm is proposing an increase every 6 months and starting soon to bring it up to \$6.25.

Many issues have not yet been decided... so stay tuned.

LIBRARY BOARD

Over the last several meetings, pros and cons of offering outlying areas the opportunity to annex into our library district were discussed. The decision was difficult but at this time it was felt that the board would take the time to adjust and become proficient with the new paper work required when they became a District Library Board instead of the Village Library Board. Voted down for the present were motions to put for public referendum the annexing of Campbell's Island and the outlying Hampton School District; and in a single measure to allow annexing of just the Hampton School District. Influencing the decision was of course, the denial of grant monies and assistance to accomplish the matter. Bonnie Bull was appointed to the board to fill the seventh slot.

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
