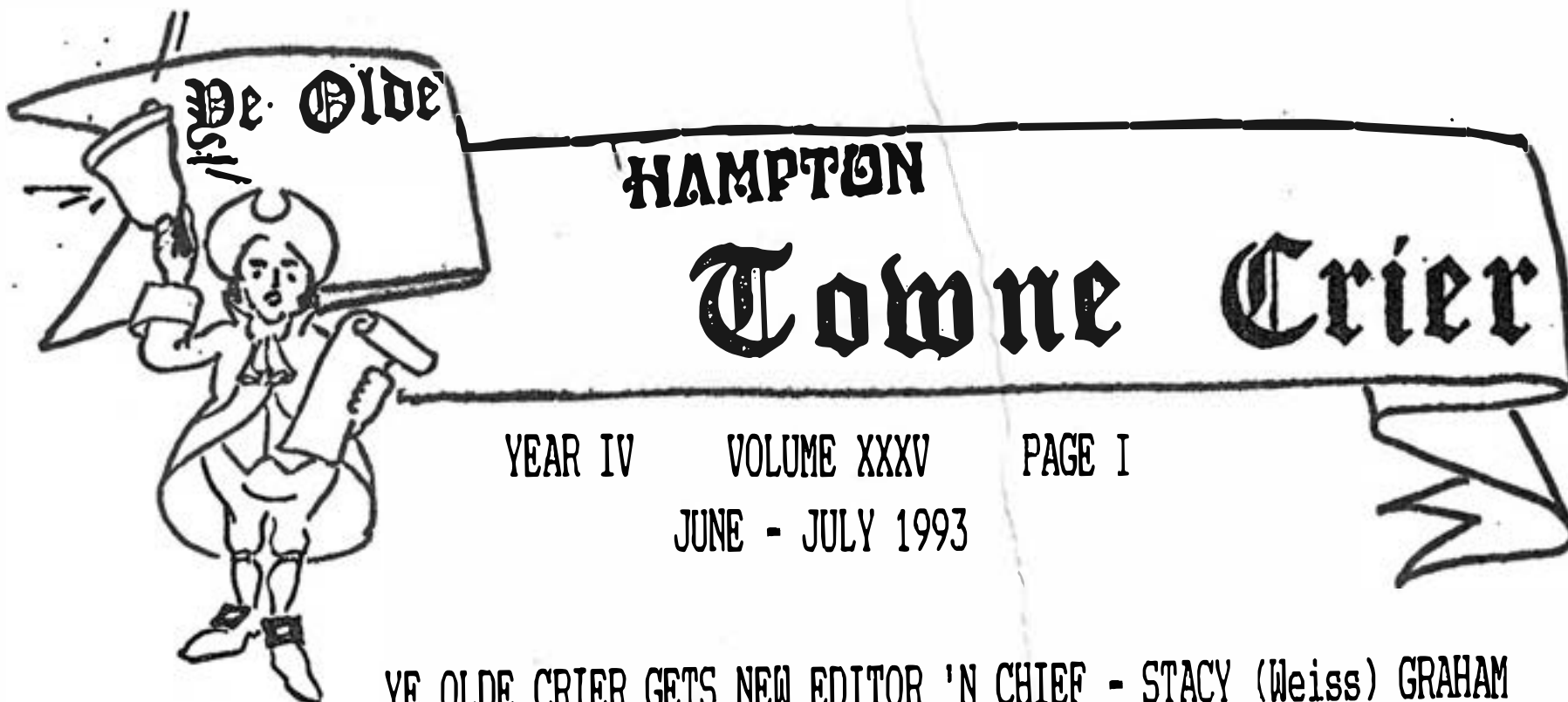




YE OLDE CRIER GETS NEW EDITOR 'N CHIEF - STACY (Weiss) GRAHAM

She became Mrs. Densford that same year. In addition to her role of wife and mother of two, she has been the sponsor of the Young Author Program, the Contig Contest, participated on school committees, and countless other things for our kids that were never visible to those of us not involved.

While she has been here, Hampton school grew from a 9 room school to a 19 room school. Unfortunately, not all of them are in use today. Her class sizes have been any where from about 18 students to 40+. That, I think, was an all time high.

She has taken it all in stride, thrived on it, grew with it. She is one terrific teacher. She has always expected her students to do the best job they were capable of doing, and because of this outlook, she usually got it.

As a resident of Hampton, you are encouraged to apply for a library card at the East Moline Library. This card is paid for by your taxes and is available at no extra cost. It puts a vast amount of information and entertainment at your finger tips. Novels, research materials, magazines, video and audio cassettes, compact discs, and much more can be found at your library and bookmobile. With a library card, you also have access to all the libraries in the Riverbend Library System - Moline, Rock Island, Davenport, and others. STOP by the East Moline Library, 740 16th Ave. for more information.

Hampton Public Library is known as a phantom library (since we have no actual library building) and contracts with the East Moline Library to provide library services to the residents of Hampton. A Library Board of Trustees exists to administer, collect, and disburse your tax dollars each year. In the past, we have also held programs at the bookmobile to promote using the library. The Board NEEDS YOUR HELP! In April, three Trustees were elected and we still need FOUR more to continue providing library cards to you. We meet approximately six times each year for one-two hours. No special training or qualifications are necessary, only a willingness and ability to attend meetings and help with the work required as a District Library. We believe this is a vital service for this community and hope that you will lend your support in our efforts.

This new, innovative recreation is actually a combination of billiards, mini-golf and free throw shooting. The chief reports that the department responded to 10 calls in April. On April 23, FF/EMT-I Jim Morris and FF/EMT-A Tim Leathers both graduated from Trinity Medical Center School of EMS, Paramedic Program. This May the department will prepare for a reinspection of our "ISO" rating. We currently hold a "7", but it is felt that might be lowered which would result in a lowering of residential fire insurance premiums. Throughout the summer the dept. will be testing all the village hydrants beginning May 11. Yamaha has provided the dept. with a "jet Ski" equipped to speedily transport 2 medics to the scene of a water related accident. Hampton began evaluation of hosting an educational program on farm rescue. This will be in conjunction with Trinity Medical Center and Andalusia Fire & Ambulance. Our officers will tour the East Moline Correctional Center to help familiarize them with procedure in the event they are called for mutual aid.

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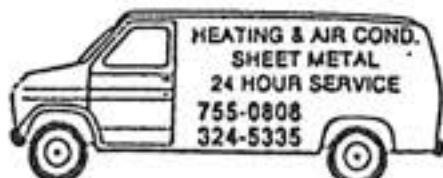
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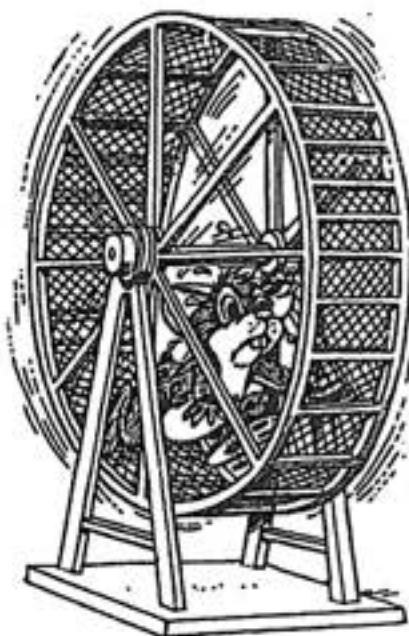


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EAST MOLINE IN RENOVATION PROGRAM

Dan, the youngest and only son, we mentioned runs the sandblasting end. He is married to Amy - they are expecting their first child in October.

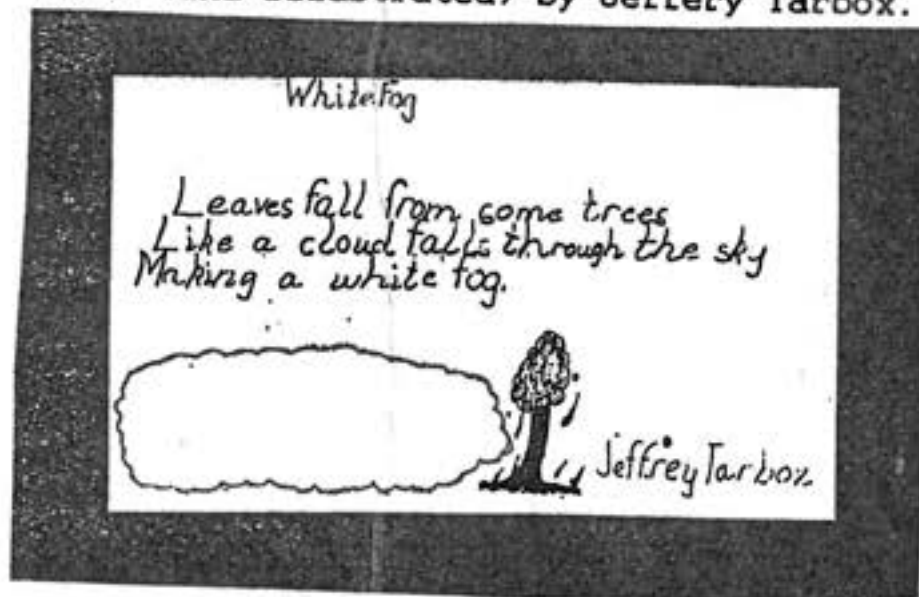
