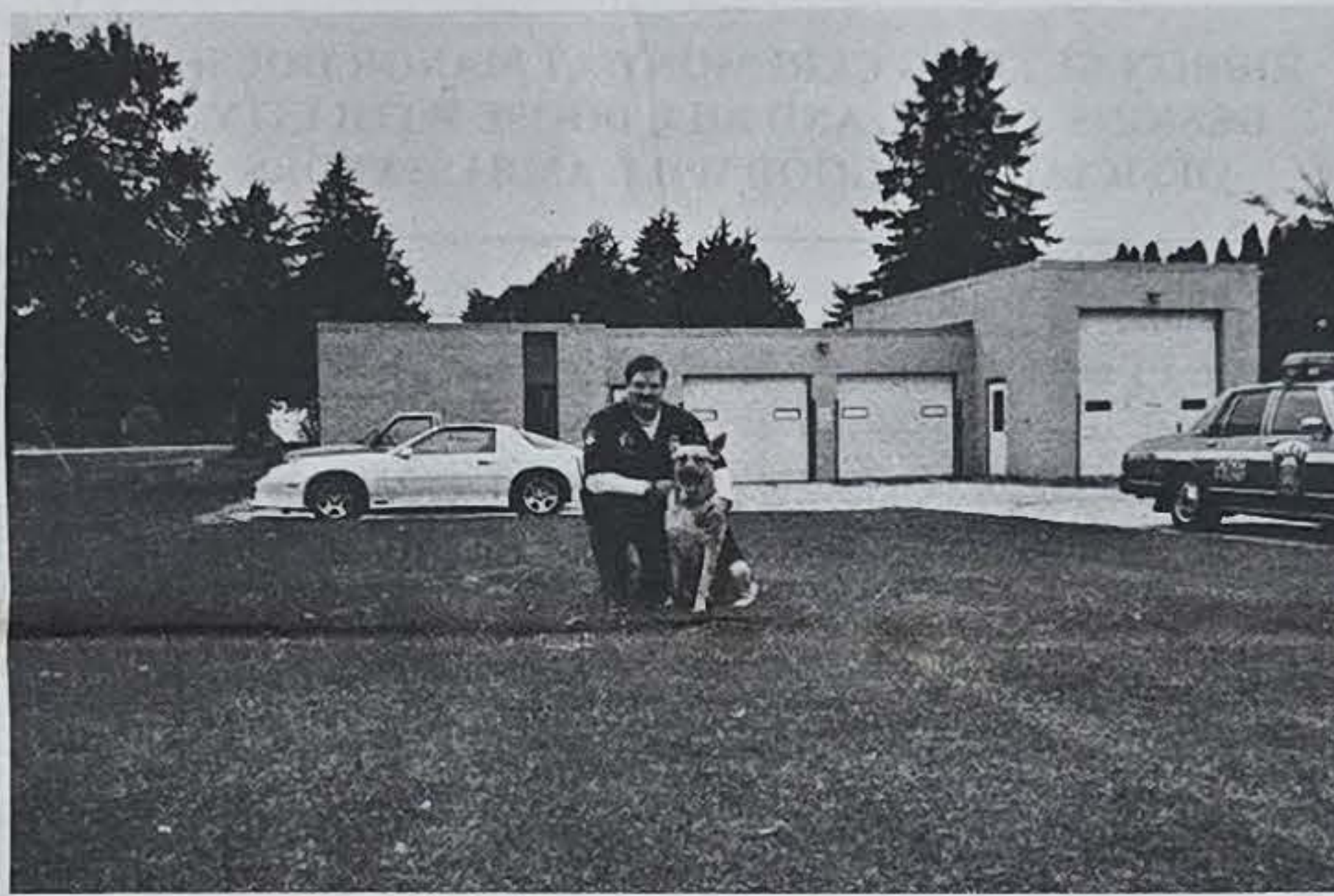

Hampton Police utilize two specially trained Police Dogs. Officer BO is a 3 1/2 year old Black Labrador that is trained to detect narcotics. Bumper a 2 1/2 year old German Shepherd is specially trained to detain criminals, track people and retrieve lost articles. Both Dogs are State Certified as well as both handlers. Bo and Sgt. Tim Ott went through 400 hours of training. Bumper and Chief Ott went through 520 hours of training. Bumper started training when he was 14 months old.

Bo is trained to find any kind of drug's. Bumper is trained for Officer safety, tracking and article search.

Most departments have dual trained dogs for both narcotics and tracking but I don't want an aggressive dog for narcotics. My reasoning on this is when Bumper gets out of the police car he knows first to protect the handler, and when the command is given to look for a lost article or he is going into a dark building looking for someone who had just broken in.

Canines are a natural choice for

article search. They are highly motivated to search, they don't care about fatigue, don't worry about getting dirty and can find things that are hidden from sight. They also tend to be faster and more accurate than humans. Using canines can drastically reduce the number of man-hours per search which will save money in the long run.

Bo has had many success stories. Bo has helped find a 4 year old who wandered away from its family. Bo is used when a car is pulled over and they suspect something wrong. They do not

use Bo on ever car pulled over.

People will do a lot of strange things to mask the odor of drugs but it's awful hard to do it. Bo has recovered drugs in all kinds of strange places.

Bumper has recovered pagers, keys, handheld police radios, a boat with bad guys that were hidden inside buildings.

Bumper has also helped to find a lost child.

When Bumper has done an excellent job he is rewarded with hamburger.

We receive frequent requests from other departments in the

area for the use of the dogs. Other than the City of Rock Island, Hampton is the only municipality in the Illinois Quad-Cities that possesses a K-9 Unit, East Moline will be starting theirs in November.

Both dogs have received high recognition at the Midwest Region United States Canine Association held in Chicago with many states participating in the competition.

Bo received top score in narcotic missed perfect by 7 points he was 3rd in the history of competition to reach that score.

Bumper 2nd in Criminal Pursuit Tracking, they simulated an Armed Robbery, and took 1st in Article Search, he had to find a single key, credit card single casing hand gun shell. This was a timed drill.

A local Artist Dorothy Pate has volunteered to paint the dogs portrait for the town after she heard that they won such outstanding awards.

The K-9 Unit has a Village Budget of \$250.00, a year and the officers must rely on community donations and our fundraisers.

Village Board Meeting

October 11, 1993

The Hampton Park parking lot is finished with a total cost of \$27,941.74.

Bids were submitted for the Dike North of town and Dan Ash trucking won the bid at \$4350.00. They are to begin as soon as possible. The dike will be raised 2 feet and compacted.

A ordinance to change the times for village board meetings was approved. The meetings will start at 7:00pm with committee meetings at 6:00pm.

Letters will be sent out to residents on 1st ave affected by the flood, that a plumbing inspector will be out to check the plumbing and to let them know that they will have to have a valve shut off put in. This is to stop river water running back into the sewers when the basements are flooded. Hopefully with this valve in place the sewer bill will not be as high.

A ordinance for drug free zone for around the School has been approved and will have signs posted soon. This is great we need to protect our children from this and other things that could possible endanger them.

Village meeting October 25, 1993.

The Auditor was present and everything went well with the audit. A couple of areas will be addressed at a special meeting of mid budget.

The Mayoral Veto was over turned, but not until a lengthy

discussion was heard. The board made a motion to help the State Street Duplexes through the winter of 93-94 and then they would have to take over the responsibility of maintaining the alley.

A motion was made to contact contractors to start to repair the sewer line.

A special meeting will be held on November 1st to make a decision on what will be done with the sewer lines, and how quickly it can be fixed.

One bid for the Lorraine Mabis Memorial was received and the total for that bid was \$10,620. This bid was presented by McDermott construction.

The Police Department has asked permission of the Board to Apply for a Federal Grant for hiring 2 full time Police Officers. The Grant will enable the town to put 2 full time officers on the streets for the cost of 2 part time officers. The grant is for 3 years and the town is under no obligation to carry it on after the 3 year time is up.

The Grant pays for 75% of the salary and the fringe benefits, The only thing it does not pay is overtime.

The Police Department will be changing dispatch locations, from Rock Island to Silvis. There are two factors that lead to this decision. One being the amount of money the town is paying monthly, Silvis is 670.00 and Rock Island is over 900.00. We would be in a lock in with Silvis to not get the price raised for 3 years. The second reason is the Fire Department is already being dispatched by Silvis. There recently

was a delay in the dispatching due to the two different dispatchers.

Curfew Minors, Under the age of 16. Between the hours of 10:00pm and 6:00am Monday through Sunday inclusive. Penalty if convicted of a violation of any section of this section shall be guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined according to the penalty clause of the Village of Hampton.

Parental Responsibility for Acts of Minors: Legal Guardian: A person appointed guardian, or given custody, of a minor by a circuit court of the state, but does not include a person appointed guardian, or given custody of a minor under the Juvenile Court Act.

Minor: A person who is above the age of 11 years but not yet 18 years of age.

Responsibility: The parent or legal guardian shall be presumed, in his absence of evidence to the contrary, to have failed to exercise proper parental responsibility and the minor shall be found to have committed the acts described below with knowledge and permission of the parent or guardian, in violation of this section, upon the occurrence of the events described below:

1). Any intentional, willful, malicious, or wanton acts causing injury to a person or property; and 2) The parent or legal guardian shall have received a

written notice either by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, or by personal service, with a certificate ore personal service returned, form the police department of the Village of Hampton following said adjudication or non-judicial sanction; and 3) If at any time within one year following receipt of the notice set forth above, the minor is either adjudicated to be in violation of any ordinance, law or statute as described above, or shall have incurred non-judicial sanctions from another official agency resulting from an admission of guilt of violation of any ordinance, law or statute as described in A-2 above.

C) Penalty: violation of this section shall result in a fine of not less than \$25.00 or more than \$500.00 for each offense.

Beast Buster Halloween Safety Program FACT SHEET.

The Beast Buster program started in 1985 by a Firefighter/paramedic who was frustrated with the sad events witnessed at Halloween time across the United States. The copyrighted program provides children a non-toxic chemical light device, which when pinned to the outside shoulder of the costume, makes the child more visible to motorists as well as watchful adults. The program is geared to children in kindergarten thru grade six in most communities. It does extend to pre-schoolers when funding is available.

In the first year, Beast Buster was presented free of charge to 5400 children in just one community. In 1993, Beast Buster will reach nearly 80,000 children in thirteen states.

The cost of the 1993 program equates to .64 cents per child.

The sponsors of the Beast Buster program are businesses

within the community, civic organizations, and individuals alone. All with the same goal; a safer community and a happy healthy childhood.

Hampton residents enjoy the sponsorship of Hampton Fire and Rescue whose donations to the program help facilitate every child possible within that community.

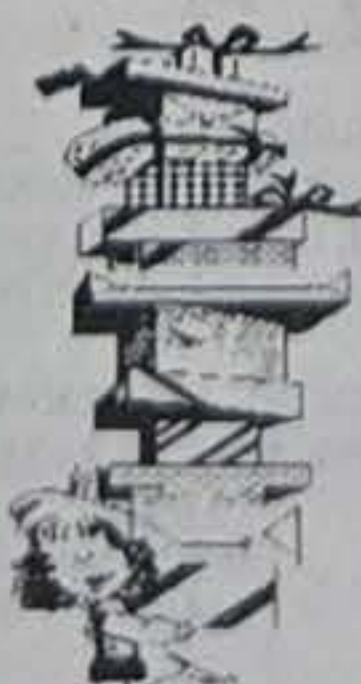

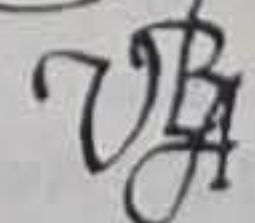

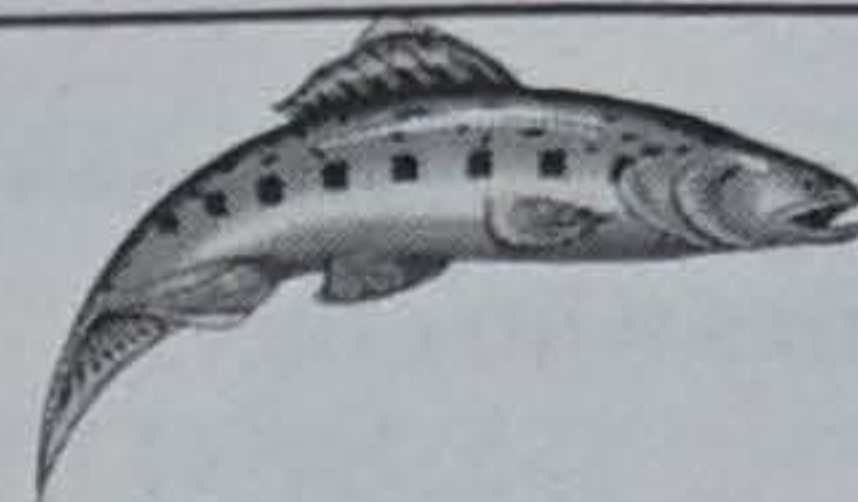
